
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2164 by House Committee on Judiciary

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2164 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2164 would require a jury commissioner who receives information from a prospective juror or court of this state that disqualifies or potentially disqualifies the juror from jury service, to submit the information to the Secretary of State for the purpose of maintaining voter registrations.

The Office of the Secretary of State indicates that any additional costs resulting from the passage of HB 2164 could be absorbed within existing resources. The Office of Judicial Administration indicates that HB 2164 could have a fiscal effect on court operations, but without knowing what information is to be reported and how the information is to be submitted it is unable to provide an estimate.
