RE: HB 2075

Abandoned vacant housing is a significant problem in many communities including Kansas City, Kansas. The number of abandoned properties has increased in the last few years due to the current economic climate. However, the problem of abandoned properties is not new. Last year, the Kansas legislature passed a law to assist with blighted commercial real estate property. We believe that a similar change in the law would be a good tool for an organization or governing body to receive ownership of a blighted residential abandoned property which then could be rehabbed.

Under HB 2075 the governing body of the city can file a petition and designate an organization to rehab the property which can then be used for housing, community development or economic development.

The city will send notice to the parties of interest on the property by certified mail to the last known address and post the property at least 20 days but nor more than 60 days before the petition is filed. If an owner can be found it is likely that the prospect of a receivership may encourage the owner to take responsibility. If a negotiated arrangement cannot be achieved at this phase a petition can be filed seeking the appointment of a receiver who can under court supervision take steps to rehab the property.

The appointment of a receiver works whether or not an owner is located. A receiver under HB 2075 is an organization or governing body of any city appointed by the court to take steps to rehab and bring the property back to code.

Liveable Neighborhoods represents 100 plus organized neighborhood groups in Kansas City, Kansas. This type of legislation would be a useful tool to help neighborhoods with cases where the owners walk away from properties rather than maintain them and the properties sit vacant subject to vandalism and illegal activity. They are an eye sore for neighbors and present a considerable public safety risk to the community.
