The KCVA is hereby submitting a revision to the budget that was submitted on September 16th, 2013. These changes are in regards to Capital Improvements. It has recently come to our attention that one of our projects to replace an elevator at \$300,000 is not necessary. However, we have requested this appropriation to address two other safety concerns. One is regarding Halsey Hall packaged terminal air-conditioners (PTAC) and involves upgrading a 40 year old system at estimated cost of \$240,000. The other is regarding the upgrading of electrical systems to resolve potential safety hazards with estimated cost of \$60,000. More information on these projects are available in the revised form DA 418B which are attached.

As always, my staff and I are prepared to provide any additional information which you or our budget analyst may require.

This project covers the annual SIBF requirements, by year for the KVH from SFY 2015 through SFY 2019. This is for emergency repairs and maintenance.

A major factor in maintenance of KVH involves the geography of the facility. The five main buildings and connected structures were built between 1948 and 1983 with the exception of the storm shelters adjacent to Timmerman and Triplett Halls. These two shelters and their connecting walkway were built in 2004. The four older structures assigned as residence halls were renovated between 1998 and 2000, through a grant. All told, the facility is spread out across 154.5 acres, and contains a total interior space of 249,287 square feet with a variety of furnishings, flooring and wall materials.
