Please add Spirit AeroSystems to the chorus of those supporting an extension of the Kansas Postsecondary Technical Education Authority (TEA). A robust technical education system is critical to Spirit's ability to sustain and grow jobs in south central Kansas. We are extremely pleased with the progress and improvement in technical education since the TEA was established in 2007 and believe an extension of the TEA is imperative to continue the momentum.

The TEA has played a key role in developing technical education curriculum to support the needs of the Kansas economy and specifically the aerospace sector. We are very supportive of an extension based on the following efforts.

1. Aligning education with the needs of business and technical programs within the education
2. Enhancing system participation
3. Funding technical education strategically
