Gun Bills in the Senate Committee on Federal and State Affairs Committee

Senate Bills

1. SB 157–Out of State and Retired Law Enforcement Officers

Allow the carrying of concealed weapons under the Personal and Family Protection Act

2. SB 158–Open Records Act–Concealed Carry

Prohibit disclosure of names, addresses, e mail, phone numbers of concealed carry licensees

3. SB 184–Concealed Carry Violations–Penalty

Criminal penalty eliminated for person who takes a concealed weapon into a building where prohibited–person can be required to leave the building.

4. SB 186–Concealed Handguns in Public and Private Building

Establishes new rules for public buildings–to either provide adequate security or to allow concealed carry licensees to carry a concealed handgun. Allows both public and private entities to prohibit concealed handguns by licensees by posting notice. Provides civil immunity for both public and private entities that provide adequate security or that allow licensees to carry concealed weapons. House Bills

5. HB 2052–Discharging a Firearm with Cities

Prohibits discharge of a firearm with cities, establishes a criminal penalty (class B misdemeanor) and establishes uniform exceptions to the prohibition.

6. HB 2055–Concealed Handguns in Public and Private Buildings

The bill is similar to SB 186. See Legislative Research Department Memo for more details.

7. HB 2199—Second Amendment Protection Act

The bill states that any personal firearm, firearm accessory, or ammunition manufactured commercially or privately within Kansas is not subject to federal regulation. The bill makes it a level 10 nonperson felony for any official, agent or employee of the federal government to violate the act.
