Educational Presentation Concerning the Appellate Courts and Appellate Clerk Jason P. Oldham, Chief Deputy Clerk Supreme Court of Kansas 785-368-7170 oldhami@kscourts.org

Good morning, my name is Jason Oldham. I am the Chief Deputy Clerk for the Appellate Courts of Kansas, the Kansas Supreme Court and Court of Appeals. I appear on behalf of Carol G. Green, the Clerk of the Appellate Courts, who regrets that she is unable to attend today.

The Supreme Court of Kansas consists of seven justices, appointed by the Governor. This Court is seniority-based and is led by the chief justice, the senior member of the Court in years of service. The Supreme Court sits in Topeka and hears appeals in week-long sessions scheduled periodically from August to May. This Court has a heavy caseload as you can see from the annual report attached to these remarks. The Court's caseload is a combination of direct appeals, cases transferred from the Kansas Court of Appeals, and cases accepted on petition for review after a decision by the Court of Appeals. In addition to their substantive caseload, the Court is also responsible for statewide administration of the Judicial Branch.

The Kansas Court of Appeals consists of thirteen judges, appointed by the Governor. This Court is led by a chief judge who is selected by the Kansas Supreme Court. This is a traveling court which can and does hold hearings anywhere in Kansas. During the past year, the Court has sat in each of the thirty-one judicial districts in the state. This Court is an appellate court of general jurisdiction; most appeals start with the Kansas Court of Appeals. As you can see from the annual report, this court has a large caseload. The Court sits in rotating three-judge panels to hear appeals and issue opinions. Senior judges and district court judges are often assigned to expand the capacity of the Court.

The Office of the Clerk of the Appellate Courts handles a great many duties and serves many functions. This office serves the case processing function for both appellate courts. All pleadings and records for appeals are filed in this office and circulated to the appropriate court and judge or justice for action.

Kansas is unique among the fifty states in the additional duties assigned to the Clerk of the Appellate Courts. We have long been frugal stewards of taxpayer funds. At the direction of the Supreme Court, the Clerk staffs and serves as secretary to the Kansas Board of Law Examiners, Client Protection Fund Commission, Board of Court Reporters, and Commission on Judicial Qualifications. Most of these functions are performed by separate offices and administrators in other states.

The Board of Law Examiners, accepts applications from persons wanting to sit for the Kansas Bar Exam, approximately 500 a year. Extensive character and fitness background checks are conducted for examinations administered twice a year. An additional 150 - 200 are admitted on corporate or reciprocal status, again after extensive character and fitness review. The Clerk also conducts annual statewide registration of Kansas attorneys. A court reporter exam is given twice a year, and the office conducts statewide annual registration of official court reporters. The Judicial Qualifications Commission reviews complaints filed by the public and issues decisions concerning judicial conduct.

The Clerk of the Appellate Courts has been designated by the Legislature to staff the Supreme Court Nominating Commission. Our office is a bee hive of activity.

I want to thank the committee for allowing me to address you today and to invite you to visit our office for a tour and further discussion. I hope this information gives you more insight into the operation of the Kansas Appellate Courts and the Clerk's Office.
