AN ACT concerning physical therapists; evaluation and treatment of patients; amending K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 65-2921 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Physical therapists may initiate licensed physician, a licensed chiropractor, a licensed dentist or licensed follows: 65-2921. (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b), (e) period of 15 business days from the initial treatment visits following the an appropriate licensed health care practitioner prior to continuing improvement, or any combination thereof, after 10 patient visits or in a practitioner, identified by the patient, a copy of the initial evaluation no treatment. 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(b) Physical therapists may evaluate and treat a patient for no more than 30 consecutive calendar days without a referral under the following conditions: (1) The patient has previously been referred to a physical therapist for physical therapy services by a person authorized by this section to approve treatment; (2) the patient's referral for physical therapy
