HB 2352; KP&F maximum benefits increased

House Bill No. 2352 increases the cap on the maximum retirement benefit for a member of the Kansas Police and Firemen's retirement system (KP&F) from 80% to 90% of a member's final average salary.

In order to pay for the increased benefit cap, commencing with the first payroll period beginning on or after July 1, 2013, each KP&F member shall increase their employee contribution rate from 7% to 7.15%.

For those members who have already hit the current benefit cap and therefore are currently contributing only 2% of their compensation, such members shall now have their contribution rate increased to 7.15%. Such members may repay in a lump sum prior to or on such member's retirement date, an amount equal to the difference between contributions actually made and contributions at the 7.15% rate. If a member makes such repayment, such member shall be entitled to service credit for purposes of calculating retirement benefits for all years of service, including those years where the contribution rate was only at 2%.
