SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2077 by House Committee on Veterans, Military and Homeland Security

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2077 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2077 would allow a licensing body to accept education, training, or service completed in military service by the applicant towards the qualifications to receive the license, unless the licensing body determines that the education, training, or service is not substantially equivalent to the standards required for licensure. The bill would also allow a licensing body to issue a temporary permit for a limited period of time to allow the military service member to lawfully practice the occupation while completing specific requirements that are required for licensure and that were not required in the state, district, or territory of the United States in which the military service member was licensed.

Enactment of HB 2077 would have no fiscal effect on the state's licensing boards. Many of them already allow licensure through reciprocity.
