SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2302 by House Committee on Health and Human Services


In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2302 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2302 would require a pre-employment screening prior to offering a position of employment to any person at the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) Laboratory. The screening would include fingerprinting, a state and national criminal history record check, as well as a drug screening test. Local and state law enforcement officers and agencies would assist KDHE with this requirement. The bill would take effect upon its publication in the *Kansas Register*.

Passage of HB 2302 would increase federal expenditures for the Kansas Department of Health and Environment by \$200 in FY 2013 and \$300 in FY 2014 and subsequent years. The estimate is based on a cost of \$100 per individual for a background check and drug screening for approximately two to three applicants per year. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2302 is not reflected in *The FY 2014 Governor's Budget Report*.
