
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2502 by House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2502 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2502 would amend the definition of “criminal history record information” by specifically excluding information regarding the release, assignment to work release, or any other change in custody status of a person confined by the Department of Corrections or a jail. Currently, the Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI) is responsible for overseeing the collection, reporting, and dissemination of criminal history record information among the courts and criminal justice agencies, particularly as it relates to the central repository.

Enactment of HB 2502 would have no fiscal effect on the Department of Corrections or the KBI.
