
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2534 by House Committee on Local Government

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2534 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2534 would allow the governing body of a city and the governing body of a school district located wholly or partially within the boundaries of that city to convert a previously established city recreation system to a school district recreation system. The bill would establish the procedure for making this conversion, and the conversion would provide for the transfer of the assets of the city recreation system, as well as the assumption of the system liabilities, and the maintenance and operation of the system. The mill levy rate for a recreation commission established under this bill would not be subject to the one mill levy limitation currently established in state law. Members of the city recreation system converted would serve the remainder of their terms as members of the school district system, and upon expiration of the terms, members would be appointed by the governing body of the school district.

According to the League of Kansas Municipalities and the Kansas Association of Counties, passage of HB 2534 would have no fiscal effect on the cities or counties of Kansas.
