SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2561 by House Committee on Health and Human Services


In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2561 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2561 would allow the Board of Pharmacy to set license and permit expiration dates through rules and regulations and includes various technical corrections or adjustments. This bill would take effect upon its publication in the statute book.

The Board of Pharmacy estimates HB 2561 would increase expenditures from the Pharmacy Fee Fund by approximately \$700 in FY 2015. The costs would include those related to payments to the Office of Information and Technology Services for database and file structure modifications at \$70 per hour. The Board indicates costs associated with modifying the Kansas.gov website for online renewals and fees would be negligible. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2561 is not reflected in *The FY 2015 Governor's Budget Report*.
