
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 329 by Senate Committee on Judiciary

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 329 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

Under current law, courts may order parents of juvenile offenders to participate in counseling, mediation sessions, alcohol and drug evaluation and treatment programs, or parenting classes as part of the juvenile offender's sentence. SB 329 would expand the list of options to include other court sponsored programs designed to rehabilitate juvenile offenders.

The Office of Judicial Administration indicates that SB 329 would have no fiscal effect on the Judicial Branch. Likewise, the Department of Corrections states that the bill would have no fiscal effect on juvenile services.
