SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 366 by Senate Committee on Ways and Means

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 366 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 366 would give the Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism authority to purchase approximately 398 acres in Cherokee County. The land would be used as a public wildlife area.

According to the Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism, the contracted price for the land that would be purchased upon passage of SB 366 is \$433,500. This amount would come from Natural Resource Damage Assessment (NRDA) funds. While the agency indicates that passage of the bill might increase the number of hunting licenses sold each year with the state, it is unable to estimate the revenue that might result from those specific sales. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 366 is not reflected in *The FY 2015 Governor's Budget Report*.
