SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 443 by Senate Committee on Ways and Means

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 443 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 443 would appropriate \$103,865,000 from the State General Fund in FY 2015 for Supplemental General State Aid, also known as Local Option Budget (LOB) State Aid, in the school finance formula. With this additional appropriation, school districts eligible to receive LOB State Aid would receive the amounts due in accordance with state law during the 2014-2015 school year, based upon estimates from the 2013 Education Consensus Meeting. In addition, SB 443 would direct that the School District Capital Outlay State Aid demand transfer be made in FY 2015, which is estimated to be \$25,200,000 in FY 2015.

Enactment of SB 443 would increase state expenditures beyond the approved budget by \$129,065,000 in FY 2015 from all funding sources, including \$103,865,000 from the State General Fund and \$25,200,000 from the School District Capital Outlay State Aid Fund. Under current law, the School District Capital Outlay State Aid Fund receives its funding from a demand transfer from the State General Fund, when Capital Outlay Aid is authorized in a fiscal



year. As a result, enactment of SB 443 would reduce State General Fund revenues by \$25,200,000 to reflect the transfer into this special revenue fund.
