1 AN ACT regulating traffic; promoting traffic safety; establishing a safety
2 corridor program; safety corridor fund; amending K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 8-
3 1560c, 8-1560d, 8-2118 and 74-7336 and repealing the existing
4 sections.

6 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

7 New Section 1. Sections 1 through 4, and amendments thereto, shall
8 be known and may be cited as the safety corridor act.

9 New Sec. 2. As used in the safety corridor act:

10 (a) "Department" means the Kansas department of transportation.

11 (b) "Secretary" means the secretary of the Kansas department of
12 transportation.

13 (c) "Executive safety council" means a group of representatives
14 appointed by the secretary who are charged with developing and
15 maintaining the strategic highway safety plan. Representatives may be
16 appointed from the Kansas department of transportation, Kansas
17 department of revenue, Kansas department of health and environment, the
18 Kansas legislature, transportation safety academia, transportation safety
19 businesses, law enforcement or local governments.

20 (d) "Safety corridor" means a segment of highway designated by the
21 secretary of transportation pursuant to the provisions of this act identified
22 by posted or moving signs as being a safety corridor. The corridor starts at
23 the first sign identifying the corridor and continues until a posted or
24 moving sign indicates that the corridor has ended.

25 New Sec. 3. (a) The secretary is hereby authorized and empowered to
26 establish and administer a safety corridor program.

27 (b) The secretary shall establish criteria and designate safety corridors
28 at the recommendation of the executive safety council. The following
29 criteria shall be used in determining designation as a safety corridor, which
30 shall include, but not be limited to:

31 (1) Accident rates and accident fatality rates, which account for the
32 number of collisions;

33 (2) number of collisions resulting in serious injury or death; and

34 (3) traffic volumes.

35 (c) The secretary shall use the same criteria on all highways in
36 determining whether a highway segment shall be designed as a safety

1 corridor.

2 (d) The secretary shall have authority to designate highway safety
3 corridors on highways that are designated as interstate, United States or
4 state highways.

5 (e) The secretary shall not designate a safety corridor on an interstate,
6 United States highway or state highway within the corporate limits of any
7 city unless the governing body of such city has passed a resolution
8 supporting the designation of a safety corridor by the secretary. If the
9 governing body of such city passes a resolution revoking its support for
10 the designation of a safety corridor within its corporate limits, upon
11 notification to the secretary that such resolution has passed, the secretary
12 shall remove the safety corridor designation from such highway that is
13 within the corporate limits of the city. All signage regarding its designation
14 as a safety corridor shall be removed from the highway. However, failure
15 to remove the signage shall not affect the status of the highway that is no
16 longer a designated safety corridor and increased fines cannot be assessed
17 for moving violations that occur within the sign marked area.

18 (f) The secretary shall establish guidelines to evaluate whether a
19 highway segment designated as a safety corridor continues to meet
20 established criteria. If the secretary determines the criteria no longer
21 applies to the segment, the designation shall be revoked, the signage shall
22 be removed and the segment shall cease to be a safety corridor.

23 (g) Annually, prior to the 10th day of each regular session of the
24 legislature, the secretary shall report to the house and senate committees
25 on transportation concerning implementation and operation of the safety
26 corridor act.

27 New Sec. 4. (a) There is hereby created in the state treasury the safety
28 corridor fund to be administered by the secretary of transportation. All
29 moneys credited to the safety corridor fund shall be used solely for
30 programs within designated safety corridors, including appropriate
31 signage, education and such other purposes deemed appropriate by the
32 secretary. All fines collected pursuant to subsection (h) of K.S.A. 8-2118,
33 and amendments thereto, shall be remitted to the state treasurer in
34 accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments
35 thereto. The state treasurer shall credit all moneys received from fines
36 pursuant to subsection (h) of K.S.A. 8-2118, and amendments thereto, in
37 accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 74-7336, and amendments
38 thereto.

39 (b) Each municipality or other governmental entity that enacts an
40 ordinance or resolution that is substantially similar to subsection (h) of
41 K.S.A. 8-2118, and amendments thereto, shall remit one half of the
42 doubled fine that is collected as a result of the conviction of a moving
43 violation in a safety corridor to the state treasurer in accordance with the

1 provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of
2 each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in
3 the state treasury to the credit of the safety corridor fund.

4 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 8-1560c is hereby amended to read as
5 follows: 8-1560c. (a) Any conviction or forfeiture of bail or bond for
6 violating a maximum posted or authorized speed limit of 30 miles per hour
7 or more but not exceeding 54 miles per hour on any highway, by not more
8 than six miles per hour, shall not be construed as a moving traffic violation
9 for the purpose of K.S.A. 8-255, and amendments thereto, *except that a*
10 *conviction of exceeding the maximum speed limit within a safety corridor*
11 *by more than five miles per hour shall be considered a moving violation*
12 *pursuant to K.S.A. 8-255, and amendments thereto.*

13 (b) Any conviction or forfeiture of bail or bond for violating the
14 maximum posted or authorized speed limit of 55 miles per hour or more
15 but not exceeding 75 miles per hour on any highway, by not more than 10
16 miles per hour, shall not be construed as a moving traffic violation for the
17 purpose of K.S.A. 8-255, and amendments thereto, *except that a*
18 *conviction of exceeding the maximum speed limit within a safety corridor*
19 *by more than five miles per hour shall be considered a moving violation*
20 *pursuant to K.S.A. 8-255, and amendments thereto.*

21 Sec. 6. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 8-1560d is hereby amended to read as
22 follows: 8-1560d. (a) *Except as provided by subsection (b)*, convictions for
23 violating a maximum posted speed limit of 55 miles per hour or more but
24 not exceeding 75 miles per hour, by not more than 10 miles per hour in
25 excess of such maximum speed limit, or a maximum posted speed limit of
26 30 miles per hour or more but not exceeding 54 miles per hour, by not
27 more than six miles per hour in excess of such maximum speed limit, shall
28 not be reported by the division and shall not be considered by any
29 insurance company in determining the rate charged for any automobile
30 liability insurance policy or whether to cancel any such policy under the
31 provisions of subsection (4)(c)(7) of K.S.A. 40-277, and amendments
32 thereto.

33 (b) *Convictions for violating a maximum speed limit within a safety*
34 *corridor by not more than five miles per hour shall not be reported by the*
35 *division and shall not be considered by any insurance company in*
36 *determining the rate charged for any automobile liability insurance policy*
37 *under the provisions of subsection (4)(c)(7) of K.S.A. 40-277, and*
38 *amendments thereto.*

39 Sec. 7. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 8-2118 is hereby amended to read as
40 follows: 8-2118. (a) A person charged with a traffic infraction shall, except
41 as provided in subsection (b), appear at the place and time specified in the
42 notice to appear. If the person enters an appearance, waives right to trial,
43 pleads guilty or no contest, the fine shall be no greater than that specified

1 in the uniform fine schedule in subsection (c) and court costs shall be
 2 taxed as provided by law.

3 (b) Prior to the time specified in the notice to appear, a person
 4 charged with a traffic infraction may enter a written appearance, waive
 5 right to trial, plead guilty or no contest and pay the fine for the violation as
 6 specified in the uniform fine schedule in subsection (c) and court costs
 7 provided by law. Payment may be made in any manner accepted by the
 8 court. The traffic citation shall not have been complied with if the payment
 9 is not honored for any reason, or if the fine and court costs are not paid in
 10 full. When a person charged with a traffic infraction makes payment
 11 without executing a written waiver of right to trial and plea of guilty or no
 12 contest, the payment shall be deemed such an appearance, waiver of right
 13 to trial and plea of no contest.

14 (c) The following uniform fine schedule shall apply uniformly
 15 throughout the state but shall not limit the fine which may be imposed
 16 following a court appearance, except an appearance made for the purpose
 17 of pleading and payment as permitted by subsection (a). The description of
 18 offense contained in the following uniform fine schedule is for reference
 19 only and is not a legal definition.

 24 (d) Traffic offenses classified as traffic infractions by this section
 25 shall be classified as ordinance traffic infractions by those cities adopting
 26 ordinances prohibiting the same offenses. A schedule of fines for all
 27 ordinance traffic infractions shall be established by the municipal judge in
 28 the manner prescribed by K.S.A. 12-4305, and amendments thereto. Such
 29 fines may vary from those contained in the uniform fine schedule
 30 contained in subsection (c).

31 (e) Fines listed in the uniform fine schedule contained in subsection
 32 (c) shall be doubled if a person is convicted of a traffic infraction, which is
 33 defined as a moving violation in accordance with rules and regulations
 34 adopted pursuant to K.S.A. 8-249, and amendments thereto, committed
 35 within any road construction zone as defined in K.S.A. 8-1458a, and
 36 amendments thereto.

37 (f) For a second violation of K.S.A. 8-1908 or 8-1909, and
 38 amendments thereto, within two years after a prior conviction of K.S.A. 8-
 39 1908 or 8-1909, and amendments thereto, such person, upon conviction
 40 shall be fined 1½ times the applicable amount from one, but not both, of
 41 the schedules listed in the uniform fine schedule contained in subsection
 42 (c). For a third violation of K.S.A. 8-1908 or 8-1909, and amendments
 43 thereto, within two years, after two prior convictions of K.S.A. 8-1908 or

1 8-1909, and amendments thereto, such person, upon conviction shall be
2 fined two times the applicable amount from one, but not both, of the
3 schedules listed in the uniform fine schedule contained in subsection (c).
4 For a fourth and each succeeding violation of K.S.A. 8-1908 or 8-1909,
5 and amendments thereto, within two years after three prior convictions of
6 K.S.A. 8-1908 or 8-1909, and amendments thereto, such person, upon
7 conviction shall be fined 2½ times the applicable amount from one, but not
8 both, of the schedules listed in the uniform fine schedule contained in
9 subsection (c).

10 (g) Fines listed in the uniform fine schedule contained in subsection
11 (c) relating to exceeding the maximum speed limit, shall be doubled if a
12 person is convicted of exceeding the maximum speed limit in a school
13 zone authorized under subsection (a)(4) of K.S.A. 8-1560, and
14 amendments thereto.

15 (h) *Fines listed in the uniform fine schedule contained in subsection*
16 *(c) shall be doubled if a person is convicted of a traffic infraction, which is*
17 *defined as a moving violation in accordance with rules and regulations*
18 *adopted pursuant to K.S.A. 8-249, and amendments thereto, committed*
19 *within any safety corridor designated pursuant to section 3, and*
20 *amendments thereto. A person may not enter into a diversion agreement in*
21 *lieu of further criminal proceedings that would prevent such person's*
22 *conviction of exceeding the maximum speed limit in a safety corridor from*
23 *appearing on the person's record.*

24 Sec. 8. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-7336 is hereby amended to read as
25 follows: 74-7336. (a) Of the remittances of fines, penalties and forfeitures
26 received from clerks of the district court, at least monthly, the state
27 treasurer shall credit:

- 28 (1) 10.94% to the crime victims compensation fund;
- 29 (2) 2.24% to the crime victims assistance fund;
- 30 (3) 2.75% to the community alcoholism and intoxication programs
31 fund;
- 32 (4) 7.65% to the department of corrections alcohol and drug abuse
33 treatment fund;
- 34 (5) 0.16% to the boating fee fund;
- 35 (6) 0.11% to the children's advocacy center fund;
- 36 (7) 2.28% to the EMS revolving fund;
- 37 (8) 2.28% to the trauma fund;
- 38 (9) 2.28% to the traffic records enhancement fund;
- 39 (10) 2.91% to the criminal justice information system line fund; ~~and~~
- 40 (11) *0.9% to the safety corridor fund, until such time as the secretary*
41 *of transportation has recouped all of the costs associated with the creation*
42 *or acquisition of signage identifying safety corridors;*
- 43 (12) 12.50% to the state safety fund;

1 (13) *12.50% to the motorcycle safety fund; and*

2 (14) the remainder of the remittances to the state general fund.

3 (b) The county treasurer shall deposit grant moneys as provided in
4 subsection (a), from the crime victims assistance fund, to the credit of a
5 special fund created for use by the county or district attorney in
6 establishing and maintaining programs to aid witnesses and victims of
7 crime.
