1 AN ACT concerning motor vehicles; relating to distinctive license plates;
2 providing for the donate life, disabled veterans, rotary international,
3 **armed forces** and Kansas horse council license plates; **motorcycles**;
4 amending K.S.A. 8-161 **and K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 8-1,141** and repealing
5 the existing section sections.

7 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

8 New Section 1. (a) On and after January 1, 2015, any owner or lessee
9 of one or more passenger vehicles~~or~~, trucks registered for a gross weight
10 of 20,000 pounds or less **or motorcycles**, who is a resident of Kansas, upon
11 compliance with the provisions of this section, may be issued one donate
12 life license plate for each such passenger vehicle~~or~~, truck **or motorcycle**.
13 Such license plates shall be issued for the same time as other license plates
14 upon proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided
15 in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and either the payment to the
16 county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment established by midwest
17 transplant network or the presentation of the annual logo use authorization
18 statement provided for in subsection (b).

19 (b) The board of directors of midwest transplant network may
20 authorize the use of their donate life logo to be affixed on license plates as
21 provided by this section. Any royalty payment received pursuant to this
22 section shall be used to support midwest transplant network. Any motor
23 vehicle owner or lessee annually may apply to midwest transplant network
24 for the use of such logo. Upon annual application and payment to either:
25 (1) Midwest transplant network in an amount of not less than \$25 nor more
26 than \$100 as a logo use royalty payment for each license plate to be issued,
27 midwest transplant network shall issue to the motor vehicle owner or
28 lessee, without further charge, a logo use authorization statement, which
29 shall be presented by the motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time of
30 registration; or (2) the county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment for
31 each license plate to be issued.

32 (c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may
33 make application for such plates not less than 60 days prior to such
34 person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished
35 by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license plate shall
36 either provide the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in

1 subsection (b) or pay to the county treasurer the logo use royalty payment
2 established by midwest transplant network. Application for registration of
3 a passenger vehicle ~~or~~, truck *or motorcycle* and issuance of the license
4 plate under this section shall be made by the owner or lessee in a manner
5 prescribed by the director of vehicles upon forms furnished by the director.

6 (d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall be
7 transferable to any other person.

8 (e) The director of vehicles may transfer donate life license plates
9 from a leased vehicle to a purchased vehicle.

10 (f) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made annually,
11 upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the manner
12 prescribed in subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-132, and amendments thereto. No
13 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant
14 provides to the county treasurer either the annual logo use authorization
15 statement provided for in subsection (b) or the payment of the logo use
16 royalty payment as established by midwest transplant network. If such
17 logo use authorization statement is not presented at the time of registration
18 or faxed by midwest transplant network, or the annual logo use royalty
19 payment is not made to the county treasurer at the time of registration, the
20 applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments
21 thereto, and return the license plate to the county treasurer of such person's
22 residence.

23 (g) Midwest transplant network shall:

24 (1) Pay the initial cost of silk-screening for license plates authorized
25 by this section; and

26 (2) provide to all county treasurers a toll-free telephone number
27 where applicants can call midwest transplant network for information
28 concerning the application process or the status of their license plate
29 application.

30 (h) Midwest transplant network, with the approval of the director of
31 vehicles and subject to the availability of materials and equipment, shall
32 design a plate to be issued under the provisions of this section.

33 (i) As a condition of receiving the donate life license plate and any
34 subsequent registration renewal of such plate, the applicant must provide
35 consent to the division authorizing the division's release of motor vehicle
36 record information, including the applicant's name, address, logo use
37 royalty payment amount, plate number and vehicle type to midwest
38 transplant network and the state treasurer.

39 (j) Annual logo use royalty payments collected by county treasurers
40 under this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance
41 with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon
42 receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire
43 amount in the state treasury to the credit of the midwest transplant network

1 royalty fund, which is hereby created in the state treasury and shall be
2 administered by the state treasurer. All expenditures from the midwest
3 transplant network royalty fund shall be made in accordance with
4 appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports
5 issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the state treasurer or the state
6 treasurer's designee. Payments from the midwest transplant network
7 royalty fund to the appropriate designee of midwest transplant network
8 shall be made on a monthly basis.

9 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 8-161 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-161. (a)
10 Any disabled veteran as defined in K.S.A. 8-160, and amendments thereto,
11 who resides in Kansas and who makes application to the director of
12 vehicles on a form furnished by the director for registration of a motor
13 vehicle that is a passenger vehicle ~~or~~, a truck with a gross weight of not
14 more than 20,000 pounds, *or a motorcycle* and is owned or leased and
15 used by such veteran may have such motor vehicle registered, and the
16 director shall issue a distinctive license plate for it. Such license plate shall
17 be issued for the same period of time as other license plates are issued.
18 Such registration shall be made and such license plates issued free of
19 charge to the disabled veteran. The director of vehicles shall also issue to
20 the disabled veteran an individual identification card which must be
21 carried by the disabled veteran when the motor vehicle being operated by
22 the disabled veteran or used for the transportation of such disabled veteran
23 is parked in a designated accessible parking space.

24 (b) Any Kansas resident who owns or leases a motor vehicle and who
25 is responsible for the transportation of a disabled veteran or any resident
26 disabled veteran desiring a distinctive license plate for a vehicle other than
27 a motor vehicle owned or leased by the veteran may make application to
28 the director of vehicles for such a license plate. Such license plate shall be
29 issued for the same period of time as other license plates are issued. There
30 shall be no fee for such license plates in addition to the regular registration
31 fee.

32 (c) The director of vehicles shall design a special license plate to be
33 issued as provided in this act. No registration or license plates issued under
34 this act shall be transferable to any other person. No registration under this
35 act shall be made until the applicant has filed with the director acceptable
36 proof that the applicant is a disabled veteran as defined by K.S.A. 8-160,
37 and amendments thereto, or is responsible for the transportation of such
38 veteran. Motor vehicles displaying the distinctive license plates provided
39 for in this act shall be permitted to park in any parking space on public or
40 private property which is clearly marked as being reserved for the use of
41 persons with a disability or persons responsible for the transportation of a
42 person with a disability, except a parking space on private property which
43 is clearly marked as being reserved for the use of a specified person with a

1 disability, or park without charge in any metered zone and shall be exempt
2 from any time limitation imposed on parking in any zone designated for
3 parking, during the hours in which parking is permitted in any city.

4 (d) Any person who willfully and falsely represents that such person
5 has the qualifications to obtain the distinctive license plates provided for
6 by this section, or who falsely utilizes the parking privilege accorded by
7 this section, shall be guilty of an unclassified misdemeanor punishable by
8 a fine of not more than \$250.

9 New Sec. 3. (a) On and after January 1, 2015, any owner or lessee of
10 one or more passenger vehicles or trucks registered for a gross weight of
11 20,000 pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance with
12 the provisions of this section, may be issued one rotary international
13 license plate for each such passenger vehicle or truck. Such license plates
14 shall be issued for the same time as other license plates upon proper
15 registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8-
16 143, and amendments thereto, and either the payment to the county
17 treasurer of the logo use royalty payment established by rotary
18 international or the presentation of the annual logo use authorization
19 statement provided for in subsection (b).

20 (b) Rotary international may authorize the use of their logo to be
21 affixed on license plates as provided by this section. Any royalty payment
22 received pursuant to this section shall be used to support rotary
23 international. Any motor vehicle owner or lessee annually may apply to
24 rotary international for the use of such logo. Upon annual application and
25 payment to either: (1) rotary international in an amount of not less than
26 \$25 nor more than \$100 as a logo use royalty payment for each license
27 plate to be issued, rotary international shall issue to the motor vehicle
28 owner or lessee, without further charge, a logo use authorization statement,
29 which shall be presented by the motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time
30 of registration; or (2) the county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment
31 for each license plate to be issued.

32 (c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may
33 make application for such plates not less than 60 days prior to such
34 person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished
35 by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license plate shall
36 either provide the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in
37 subsection (b) or pay to the county treasurer the logo use royalty payment
38 established by rotary international. Application for registration of a
39 passenger vehicle or truck and issuance of the license plate under this
40 section shall be made by the owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the
41 director of vehicles upon forms furnished by the director.

42 (d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall be
43 transferable to any other person.

1 (e) The director of vehicles may transfer rotary international license
2 plates from a leased vehicle to a purchased vehicle.

3 (f) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made annually,
4 upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the manner
5 prescribed in subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-132, and amendments thereto. No
6 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant
7 either provides to the county treasurer either the annual logo use
8 authorization statement provided for in subsection (b) or the payment of
9 the logo use royalty payment as established by rotary international. If such
10 logo use authorization statement is not presented at the time of registration
11 or faxed by rotary international, or the annual logo use royalty payment is
12 not made to the county treasurer at the time of registration, the applicant
13 shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto,
14 and return the license plate to the county treasurer of such person's
15 residence.

16 (g) Rotary international shall:

17 (1) Pay the initial cost of silk-screening for license plates authorized
18 by this section; and

19 (2) provide to all county treasurers a toll-free telephone number
20 where applicants can call rotary international for information concerning
21 the application process or the status of their license plate application.

22 (h) Rotary international, with the approval of the director of vehicles
23 and subject to the availability of materials and equipment, shall design a
24 plate to be issued under the provisions of this section.

25 (i) As a condition of receiving the rotary international license plate
26 and any subsequent registration renewal of such plate, the applicant must
27 provide consent to the division authorizing the division's release of motor
28 vehicle record information, including the applicant's name, address, logo
29 use royalty payment amount, plate number and vehicle type to rotary
30 international and the state treasurer.

31 (j) Annual logo use royalty payments collected by county treasurers
32 under this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance
33 with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon
34 receipt of each such remittance the state treasurer shall deposit the entire
35 amount in the state treasury to the credit of the rotary international royalty
36 fund, which is hereby created in the state treasury and shall be
37 administered by the state treasurer. All expenditures from the rotary
38 international royalty fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation
39 acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant
40 to vouchers approved by the state treasurer or the state treasurer's
41 designee. Payments from the rotary international royalty fund to the
42 appropriate designee of the rotary international shall be made on a monthly
43 basis.

1 New Sec. 4. (a) On and after January 1, 2015, any owner or lessee of
2 one or more passenger vehicles, trailers or trucks registered for a gross
3 weight of 20,000 pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon
4 compliance with the provisions of this section, may be issued one Kansas
5 horse council license plate for each such passenger vehicle, trailer or truck.
6 Such license plates shall be issued for the same time as other license plates
7 upon proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided
8 in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and either the payment to the
9 county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment established by the Kansas
10 horse council or the presentation of the annual logo use authorization
11 statement provided for in subsection (b).

12 (b) The Kansas horse council may authorize the use of their logo to
13 be affixed on license plates as provided by this section. Any royalty
14 payment received pursuant to this section shall be used to support the
15 Kansas horse council. Any motor vehicle owner or lessee annually may
16 apply to the Kansas horse council for the use of such logo. Upon annual
17 application and payment to either: (1) The Kansas horse council in an
18 amount of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 as a logo use royalty
19 payment for each license plate to be issued, the Kansas horse council shall
20 issue to the motor vehicle owner or lessee, without further charge, a logo
21 use authorization statement, which shall be presented by the motor vehicle
22 owner or lessee at the time of registration; or (2) the county treasurer of
23 the logo use royalty payment for each license plate to be issued.

24 (c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may
25 make application for such plates not less than 60 days prior to such
26 person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished
27 by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license plate shall
28 either provide the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in
29 subsection (b) or pay to the county treasurer the logo use royalty payment
30 established by the Kansas horse council. Application for registration of a
31 passenger vehicle, trailer or truck and issuance of the license plate under
32 this section shall be made by the owner or lessee in a manner prescribed
33 by the director of vehicles upon forms furnished by the director.

34 (d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall be
35 transferable to any other person.

36 (e) The director of vehicles may transfer the Kansas horse council
37 license plates from a leased vehicle to a purchased vehicle.

38 (f) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made annually,
39 upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the manner
40 prescribed in subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-132, and amendments thereto. No
41 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant
42 either provides to the county treasurer either the annual logo use
43 authorization statement provided for in subsection (b) or the payment of

1 the logo use royalty payment as established by the Kansas horse council. If
2 such logo use authorization statement is not presented at the time of
3 registration or faxed by the Kansas horse council, or the annual logo use
4 royalty payment is not made to the county treasurer at the time of
5 registration, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8-143,
6 and amendments thereto, and return the license plate to the county
7 treasurer of such person's residence.

8 (g) The Kansas horse council shall:

9 (1) Pay the initial cost of silk-screening for license plates authorized
10 by this section; and

11 (2) provide to all county treasurers a toll-free telephone number
12 where applicants can call the Kansas horse council for information
13 concerning the application process or the status of their license plate
14 application.

15 (h) The Kansas horse council, with the approval of the director of
16 vehicles and subject to the availability of materials and equipment, shall
17 design a plate to be issued under the provisions of this section.

18 (i) As a condition of receiving the Kansas horse council license plate
19 and any subsequent registration renewal of such plate, the applicant must
20 provide consent to the division authorizing the division's release of motor
21 vehicle record information, including the applicant's name, address, logo
22 use royalty payment amount, plate number and vehicle type to the Kansas
23 horse council and the state treasurer.

24 (j) Annual logo use royalty payments collected by county treasurers
25 under this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance
26 with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon
27 receipt of each such remittance the state treasurer shall deposit the entire
28 amount in the state treasury to the credit of the Kansas horse council
29 royalty fund, which is hereby created in the state treasury and shall be
30 administered by the state treasurer. All expenditures from the Kansas horse
31 council royalty fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts
32 upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to
33 vouchers approved by the state treasurer or the state treasurer's designee.
34 Payments from the Kansas horse council royalty fund to the appropriate
35 designee of the Kansas horse council shall be made on a monthly basis.

36 ***Sec. 5. K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 8-1,141 is hereby amended to read as***
37 ***follows: 8-1,141. (a) Any new distinctive license plate authorized for***
38 ***issuance on and after July 1, 1994, shall be subject to the personalized***
39 ***license plate fee prescribed by subsection (c) of K.S.A. 8-132, and***
40 ***amendments thereto. This section shall not apply to any distinctive***
41 ***license plate authorized prior to July 1, 1994.***

42 ***(b) The director of vehicles shall not issue any new distinctive***
43 ***license plate authorized for issuance on and after July 1, 1995, unless***

1 *there is a guarantee of an initial issuance of at least 500 license plates.*

2 *(c) The provisions of this section shall not apply to distinctive*
3 *license plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,145, or K.S.A.*
4 *2013 Supp. 8-177d, 8-1,163 or 8-1,166, and amendments thereto.*

5 *(d) The provisions of subsection (a), shall not apply to distinctive*
6 *license plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,146 or 8-1,148,*
7 *and amendments thereto, or K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 8-1,153, 8-1,158 or 8-*
8 *1,161, and amendments thereto.*

9 *(e) The provisions of subsection (f) shall not apply to distinctive*
10 *license plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 8-1,160,*
11 *and amendments thereto, except that the division shall delay the*
12 *manufacturing and issuance of such distinctive license plate until the*
13 *division has received not less than 1,000 orders for such plate, including*
14 *payment of the personalized license plate fee required under subsection*
15 *(a). Upon certification by the director of vehicles to the director of*
16 *accounts and reports that not less than 1,000 paid orders for such plate*
17 *have been received, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer*
18 *\$40,000 from the state highway fund to the distinctive license plate fund.*

19 *(f) (1) Any person or organization sponsoring any distinctive*
20 *license plate authorized by the legislature on and after July 1, 2004,*
21 *shall submit to the division of vehicles a nonrefundable amount not to*
22 *exceed \$20,000, to defray the division's cost for developing such*
23 *distinctive license plate.*

24 *(2) All moneys received under this subsection shall be remitted by*
25 *the secretary of revenue to the state treasurer in accordance with the*
26 *provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of*
27 *each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount*
28 *in the state treasury to the credit of the distinctive license plate fund*
29 *which is hereby created in the state treasury. All moneys credited to the*
30 *distinctive license plate fund shall be used by the department of revenue*
31 *only for the purpose associated with the development of distinctive*
32 *license plates. All expenditures from the distinctive license plate*
33 *application fee fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation*
34 *acts, upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued*
35 *pursuant to vouchers approved by the secretary of the department of*
36 *revenue.*

37 *(g) (1) Except for educational institution license plates issued under*
38 *K.S.A. 8-1,142, and amendments thereto, the director of vehicles shall*
39 *discontinue the issuance of any distinctive license plate authorized prior*
40 *to July 1, 2004, and which is subject to the provisions of subsection (b)*
41 *if:*

42 *(A) Less than 500 license plates, including annual renewals, are*
43 *issued for that distinctive license plate by July 1, 2006; and*

1 ***(B) less than 250 license plates, including annual renewals, are***
2 ***issued for that distinctive license plate during any subsequent two-year***
3 ***period after July 1, 2006.***

4 ***(2) The director of vehicles shall discontinue the issuance of any***
5 ***distinctive license plate authorized on and after July 1, 2004, if:***

6 ***(A) Less than 500 plates, including annual renewals, are issued for***
7 ***that distinctive license plate by the end of the second year of sales; and***

8 ***(B) less than 250 license plates, including annual renewals, are***
9 ***issued for that distinctive license plate during any subsequent two-year***
10 ***period.***

11 ***(h) An application for any distinctive license plate issued after***
12 ***December 31, 2012, and the corresponding royalty fee may be collected***
13 ***either by the county treasurer or the entity benefiting from the issuance***
14 ***of the distinctive license plate. Annual royalty payments collected by the***
15 ***county treasurers shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance***
16 ***with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon***
17 ***receipt of each such remittance the state treasurer shall deposit the***
18 ***entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of a segregated royalty***
19 ***fund which shall be administered by the state treasurer. All expenditures***
20 ***from the royalty fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation***
21 ***acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued***
22 ***pursuant to vouchers approved by the state treasurer or the state***
23 ***treasurer's designee. Payments from the royalty fund shall be made to***
24 ***the entity benefiting from the issuance of the distinctive license plate on***
25 ***a monthly basis.***

26 ***(i) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for any distinctive***
27 ***license plate, the division shall produce such distinctive license plate for a***
28 ***motorcycle upon request to the division by the organization sponsoring the***
29 ***distinctive license plate.***

30 ***(j) In addition to any residency requirements for all distinctive license***
31 ***plates, any person not a resident of Kansas, serving as a member of the***
32 ***armed forces stationed in this state shall be eligible to apply for any***
33 ***distinctive license plate as if the individual was a resident of this state.***
34 ***Such person shall be eligible to renew the distinctive license plate***
35 ***registration as long as the person is still stationed in this state at the time***
36 ***the registration is renewed.***

37 ***Sec. ~~5~~ 6. K.S.A. 8-161 ~~is~~ and K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 8-1,141 are hereby***

39 ***Sec. ~~6~~ 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its***
40 ***publication in the statute book.***
