1 AN ACT concerning the board of pharmacy; relating to licensure of
2 pharmacists and registration of pharmacist interns; amending K.S.A.
3 65-1632 and 65-1644 and K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 65-1643, 65-1645 and
4 65-1663 and repealing the existing sections.
5

6 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

7 Section 1. K.S.A. 65-1632 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-
8 1632. (a) *Except as otherwise provided in this section, each license to*
9 *practice as a pharmacist issued by the board, shall expire on June 30 of the*
10 *year specified by the board for the expiration of the license and shall be*
11 *renewed on a biennial basis in accordance with this section every two*
12 *years. The expiration date shall be established by rules and regulations*
13 *adopted by the board. Each application for renewal of a license as a*
14 *pharmacist shall be made on a form prescribed and furnished by the board.*
15 *Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the application, when*
16 *accompanied by the renewal fee and received by the executive secretary of*
17 *the board on or before the date of expiration of the license, shall have the*
18 *effect of temporarily renewing the applicant's license until actual issuance*
19 *or denial of the renewal. If at the time of filing a proceeding is pending*
20 *before the board which may result in the suspension, probation, revocation*
21 *or denial of the applicant's license, the board may by emergency order*
22 *declare that the application for renewal shall not have the effect of*
23 *temporarily renewing such applicant's license. Every licensed pharmacist*
24 *shall pay to the secretary of the board a renewal fee fixed by the board as*
25 *provided in K.S.A. 65-1645, and amendments thereto.*

26 (b) ~~Commencing with the renewal of licenses which expire on June~~
27 ~~30, 1998, each license shall be renewed on a biennial basis. To provide for~~
28 ~~a system of biennial renewal of licenses, the board may provide by rules~~
29 ~~and regulations that licenses issued or renewed may expire less than two~~
30 ~~years from the date of issuance or renewal. License fees may be prorated~~
31 ~~for licensure periods which are less than biennial in accordance with rules~~
32 ~~and regulations of the board.~~

33 (c) The board may deny renewal of any license of a pharmacist on
34 any ground which would authorize the board to deny an initial application
35 for licensure or on any ground which would authorize the board to
36 suspend, revoke or place on probation a license previously granted. Orders

1 under this section, and proceedings thereon, shall be subject to the
2 provisions of the Kansas administrative procedure act.

3 (d) The payment of the renewal fee by a person who is a holder of a
4 license as a pharmacist shall entitle the person to renewal of license if no
5 grounds exist for denying the renewal of the license and if the person has
6 furnished satisfactory evidence to the board that the person has
7 successfully complied with the rules and regulations of the board relating
8 to continuing professional education. These educational requirements shall
9 be fixed by the board at not less than 20 clock hours nor more than 40
10 clock hours biennially of a program of continuing education approved by
11 the board. Continuing education hours may be prorated for licensure
12 periods which are less than biennial in accordance with rules and
13 regulations of the board. The maximum number of continuing education
14 hours required by the board to meet the requirements for cancellation of
15 inactive status licensure and renewal of license under subsection (e) or
16 reinstatement of license because of nonpayment of fees under subsection
17 (f) shall not exceed 60.

18 (e) The payment of the renewal fee by the person who is a holder of a
19 license as a pharmacist but who has not complied with the continuing
20 education requirements fixed by the board, if no grounds exist for denying
21 the renewal of the license other than that the person has not complied with
22 the continuing education requirements fixed by the board, shall entitle the
23 person to inactive status licensure by the board. No person holding an
24 inactive status license from the board shall engage in the practice of
25 pharmacy in this state. Upon furnishing satisfactory evidence to the board
26 of compliance with the continuing education requirements fixed by the
27 board and upon the payment to the board of all applicable fees, a person
28 holding an inactive status license from the board shall be entitled to
29 cancellation of the inactive status license and to renewal of licensure as a
30 pharmacist.

31 (f) If the renewal fee for any pharmacist's license has not been paid
32 ~~by August 1~~ *prior to the expiration of the license* of the renewal year, the
33 license is hereby declared void, and no license shall be reinstated except
34 upon payment of any unpaid renewal fee plus a penalty fee fixed by the
35 board as provided in K.S.A. 65-1645, and amendments thereto, and proof
36 satisfactory to the board of compliance with the continuing education
37 requirements fixed by the board. The penalty fee established by this
38 section immediately prior to the effective date of the act shall continue
39 in effect until a different penalty fee is fixed by the board by rules and
40 regulations as provided in K.S.A. 65-1645, and amendments thereto.
41 Payment of any unpaid renewal fee plus a penalty fee and the submission
42 of proof satisfactory to the board of compliance with the continuing
43 education requirements fixed by the board shall entitle the license to be

1 reinstated. The nonpayment of renewal fees by a previously licensed
2 pharmacist for a period exceeding three years shall not deprive the
3 previously licensed pharmacist of the right to reinstate the license upon the
4 payment of any unpaid fees and penalties and upon compliance with the
5 continuing education requirements fixed by the board, except that the
6 board may require such previously licensed pharmacist to take and pass an
7 examination approved by the board for reinstatement as a pharmacist and
8 to pay any applicable application fee.

9 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 65-1643 is hereby amended to read as
10 follows: 65-1643. It shall be unlawful:

11 (a) For any person to operate, maintain, open or establish any
12 pharmacy within this state without first having obtained a registration from
13 the board. Each application for registration of a pharmacy shall indicate
14 the person or persons desiring the registration, including the pharmacist in
15 charge, as well as the location, including the street name and number, and
16 such other information as may be required by the board to establish the
17 identity and exact location of the pharmacy. The issuance of a registration
18 for any pharmacy shall also have the effect of permitting such pharmacy to
19 operate as a retail dealer without requiring such pharmacy to obtain a retail
20 dealer's permit. On evidence satisfactory to the board: (1) That the
21 pharmacy for which the registration is sought will be conducted in full
22 compliance with the law and the rules and regulations of the board; (2) that
23 the location and appointments of the pharmacy are such that it can be
24 operated and maintained without endangering the public health or safety;
25 *and* (3) that the pharmacy will be under the supervision of a pharmacist, a
26 registration shall be issued to such persons as the board shall deem
27 qualified to conduct such a pharmacy.

28 (b) For any person to manufacture within this state any drugs except
29 under the personal and immediate supervision of a pharmacist or such
30 other person or persons as may be approved by the board after an
31 investigation and a determination by the board that such person or persons
32 is qualified by scientific or technical training or experience to perform
33 such duties of supervision as may be necessary to protect the public health
34 and safety; and no person shall manufacture any such drugs without first
35 obtaining a registration so to do from the board. Such registration shall be
36 subject to such rules and regulations with respect to requirements,
37 sanitation and equipment, as the board may from time to time adopt for the
38 protection of public health and safety.

39 (c) For any person to distribute at wholesale any drugs without first
40 obtaining a registration so to do from the board.

41 (d) For any person to sell or offer for sale at public auction or private
42 sale in a place where public auctions are conducted, any drugs without first
43 having obtained a registration from the board so to do, and it shall be

1 necessary to obtain the permission of the board in every instance where
2 any of the products covered by this section are to be sold or offered for
3 sale.

4 (e) For any person to in any manner distribute or dispense samples of
5 any drugs without first having obtained a permit from the board so to do,
6 and it shall be necessary to obtain permission from the board in every
7 instance where the samples are to be distributed or dispensed. Nothing in
8 this subsection shall be held to regulate or in any manner interfere with the
9 furnishing of samples of drugs to duly licensed practitioners, to mid-level
10 practitioners, to pharmacists or to medical care facilities.

11 (f) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection (f), for any person
12 operating a store or place of business to sell, offer for sale or distribute any
13 drugs to the public without first having obtained a registration or permit
14 from the board authorizing such person so to do. No retail dealer who sells
15 12 or fewer different nonprescription drug products shall be required to
16 obtain a retail dealer's permit under the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas
17 or to pay a retail dealer new permit or permit renewal fee under such act. It
18 shall be lawful for a retail dealer who is the holder of a valid retail dealer's
19 permit issued by the board or for a retail dealer who sells 12 or fewer
20 different nonprescription drug products to sell and distribute
21 nonprescription drugs which are prepackaged, fully prepared by the
22 manufacturer or distributor for use by the consumer and labeled in
23 accordance with the requirements of the state and federal food, drug and
24 cosmetic acts. Such nonprescription drugs shall not include: (1) A
25 controlled substance; (2) a prescription-only drug; or (3) a drug product
26 intended for human use by hypodermic injection; but such a retail dealer
27 shall not be authorized to display any of the words listed in subsection (dd)
28 of K.S.A. 65-1626, and amendments thereto, for the designation of a
29 pharmacy or drugstore.

30 (g) For any person to sell any drugs manufactured and sold only in
31 the state of Kansas, unless the label and directions on such drugs shall first
32 have been approved by the board.

33 (h) For any person to operate an institutional drug room without first
34 having obtained a registration to do so from the board. Such registration
35 shall be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 65-1637a, and amendments
36 thereto and any rules and regulations adopted pursuant thereto.

37 ~~(i) For any person to be a pharmacy student without first obtaining a~~
38 ~~registration to do so from the board, in accordance with rules and~~
39 ~~regulations adopted by the board, and paying a pharmacy student~~
40 ~~registration fee of \$25 to the board.~~

41 ~~(j)~~ For any person to operate a veterinary medical teaching hospital
42 pharmacy without first having obtained a registration to do so from the
43 board. Such registration shall be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 65-

1 1662, and amendments thereto and any rules and regulations adopted
2 pursuant thereto.

3 ~~(k)~~(j) For any person to sell or distribute in a pharmacy a controlled
4 substance designated in subsection (e) or (f) of K.S.A. 65-4113, and
5 amendments thereto, unless:

6 (1) (A) Such controlled substance is sold or distributed by a licensed
7 pharmacist, a registered pharmacy technician or a pharmacy intern or clerk
8 supervised by a licensed pharmacist;

9 (B) any person purchasing, receiving or otherwise acquiring any such
10 controlled substance produces a photo identification showing the date of
11 birth of the person and signs a log and enters in the log, or allows the seller
12 to enter in the log, such person's address and the date and time of sale or
13 allows the seller to enter such information into an electronic logging
14 system pursuant to K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 65-16,102, and amendments
15 thereto. The log or database required by the board shall be available for
16 inspection during regular business hours to the board of pharmacy and any
17 law enforcement officer;

18 (C) the seller determines that the name entered in the log corresponds
19 to the name provided on such identification and that the date and time
20 entered are correct; and

21 (D) the seller enters in the log the name of the controlled substance
22 and the quantity sold; or

23 (2) there is a lawful prescription.

24 ~~(h)~~(k) For any pharmacy to allow customers to have direct access to
25 any controlled substance designated in subsection (e) or (f) of K.S.A. 65-
26 4113, and amendments thereto. Such controlled substance shall be placed
27 behind the counter or stored in a locked cabinet that is located in an area of
28 the pharmacy to which customers do not have direct access.

29 ~~(m)~~(l) A seller who in good faith releases information in a log
30 pursuant to subsection ~~(k)~~(j) to any law enforcement officer is immune
31 from civil liability for such release unless the release constitutes gross
32 negligence or intentional, wanton or willful misconduct.

33 ~~(n)~~(m) For any person to sell or lease or offer for sale or lease durable
34 medical equipment without first obtaining a registration from the board, in
35 accordance with rules and regulations adopted by the board, except that
36 this subsection shall not apply to:

37 (1) Sales not made in the regular course of the person's business; or

38 (2) sales by charitable organizations exempt from federal income
39 taxation pursuant to the internal revenue code of 1986, as amended.

40 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 65-1644 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-
41 1644. The board may issue duplicate licenses, registrations or permits
42 upon return of the original, or upon a sworn statement that the original has
43 been lost or destroyed, and has not been given away or disposed of to

1 some other person. Applications for such duplicate licenses, registrations
2 and permits and the affidavits required by this section shall be made on
3 forms furnished by the board. The fee for the issuance of a duplicate
4 registration or permit shall ~~be~~ *not exceed* \$1.25 for permits, and \$10 for
5 certificates of registration.

6 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 65-1645 is hereby amended to read as
7 follows: 65-1645. (a) Application for registrations or permits under K.S.A.
8 65-1643, and amendments thereto, shall be made on a form prescribed and
9 furnished by the board. Applications for registration to distribute at
10 wholesale any drugs shall contain such information as may be required by
11 the board in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 65-1655, and
12 amendments thereto. The application shall be accompanied by the fee
13 prescribed by the board under the provisions of this section. When such
14 application and fees are received by the executive secretary of the board
15 on or before the due date, such application shall have the effect of
16 temporarily renewing the applicant's registration or permit until actual
17 issuance or denial of the renewal. However, if at the time of filing a
18 proceeding is pending before the board which may result in the
19 suspension, probation, revocation or denial of the applicant's registration
20 or permit, the board may declare, by emergency order, that such
21 application for renewal shall not have the effect of temporarily renewing
22 such applicant's registration or permit. Separate applications shall be made
23 and separate registrations or permits issued for each separate place at
24 which is carried on any of the operations for which a registration or permit
25 is required by K.S.A. 65-1643, and amendments thereto, ~~except that the~~
26 ~~board may provide for a single registration for a business entity registered~~
27 ~~to manufacture any drugs or registered to distribute at wholesale any drugs~~
28 ~~and operating more than one facility within the state, or for a parent entity~~
29 ~~with divisions, subsidiaries or affiliate companies, or any combination~~
30 ~~thereof, within the state when operations are conducted at more than one~~
31 ~~location and there exists joint ownership and control among all the entities.~~

32 (b) The nonrefundable fees required for the issuing of the licenses,
33 registrations or permits under the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas shall
34 be fixed by the board as herein provided, subject to the following:

35 (1) Pharmacy, new registration not more than \$150, renewal not more
36 than \$125;

37 (2) pharmacist, new license by examination not more than \$350;

38 (3) pharmacist, reinstatement application fee not more than \$250;

39 (4) pharmacist, biennial renewal fee not more than \$200;

40 (5) pharmacist, evaluation fee not more than \$250;

41 (6) pharmacist, reciprocal licensure fee not more than \$250;

42 (7) pharmacist, penalty fee, not more than \$500;

43 (8) manufacturer, new registration not more than \$500, renewal not

1 more than \$400;

2 (9) wholesaler, new registration not more than \$500, renewal not
3 more than \$400, except that a wholesaler dealing exclusively in
4 nonprescription drugs, the manufacturing, distributing or dispensing of
5 which does not require registration under the uniform controlled
6 substances act, shall be assessed a fee for registration and reregistration
7 not to exceed \$50;

8 (10) special auction not more than \$50;

9 (11) samples distribution not more than \$50, *renewal not more than*
10 *\$50*;

11 (12) institutional drug room, new registration not more than \$40,
12 renewal not more than \$35;

13 (13) retail dealer selling more than 12 different nonprescription drug
14 products, new permit not more than \$12, renewal not more than \$12;

15 (14) certification of grades for each applicant for examination and
16 registration not more than \$25;

17 (15) veterinary medical teaching hospital pharmacy, new registration
18 not more than \$40, renewal not more than \$35; or

19 (16) durable medical equipment registration fee, not more than \$300,
20 *renewal not more than \$300*.

21 (c) For the purpose of fixing fees, the board may establish classes of
22 retail dealers' permits for retail dealers selling more than 12 different
23 nonprescription drug products, and the board may fix a different fee for
24 each such class of permit.

25 (d) The board shall determine annually the amount necessary to carry
26 out and enforce the provisions of this act for the next ensuing fiscal year
27 and shall fix by rules and regulations the fees authorized for such year at
28 the sum deemed necessary for such purposes. The fees fixed by the board
29 under this section immediately prior to the effective date of this act shall
30 continue in effect until different fees are fixed by the board by rules and
31 regulations as provided under this section.

32 (e) The board may deny renewal of any registration or permit
33 required by K.S.A. 65-1643, and amendments thereto, on any ground
34 which would authorize the board to suspend, revoke or place on probation
35 a registration or permit previously granted pursuant to the provisions of
36 K.S.A. 65-1643, and amendments thereto. Registrations and permits issued
37 under the provisions of K.S.A. 65-1643 and 65-1644, and amendments
38 thereto, shall be conspicuously displayed in the place for which the
39 registration or permit was granted. Such registrations or permits shall not
40 be transferable. All such registrations and permits ~~except retail dealer~~
41 ~~permits shall expire on June 30 following date of issuance every year. The~~
42 ~~expiration date shall be established by rules and regulations adopted by~~
43 ~~the board. Retail dealers' permits shall expire on the last day of February.~~

1 All registrations and permits shall be renewed annually. ~~Application blanks~~
2 ~~for~~ *Notice of renewal* of registrations and permits shall be mailed by the
3 board to each registrant or permittee at least 30 days prior to expiration of
4 the registration or permit. If application for renewal is not made ~~before 30~~
5 ~~days after such~~ *prior to* expiration, the existing registration or permit shall
6 lapse and become null and void on the date of its expiration, and no new
7 registration or permit shall be granted except upon payment of the required
8 renewal fee plus a penalty equal to the renewal fee. Failure of any
9 registrant or permittee to receive such ~~application blank~~ *notice of renewal*
10 shall not relieve the registrant or permittee from the penalty hereby
11 imposed if the renewal is not made as prescribed.

12 (f) In each case in which a license of a pharmacist is issued or
13 renewed for a period of time less than two years, the board shall prorate to
14 the nearest whole month the license or renewal fee established pursuant to
15 this section.

16 (g) The board may require that fees paid for any examination under
17 the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas be paid directly to the examination
18 service by the person taking the examination.

19 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 65-1663 is hereby amended to read as
20 follows: 65-1663. (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to function as a
21 pharmacy technician in this state unless such person is registered with the
22 board as a pharmacy technician. Every person registered as a pharmacy
23 technician shall pass an examination approved by the board within 30 days
24 of becoming registered. The board shall adopt rules and regulations
25 establishing the criteria for the required examination and a passing score.

26 (b) All applications for registration shall be made on a form to be
27 prescribed and furnished by the board. Each application for registration
28 shall be accompanied by a registration fee fixed by the board by rule and
29 regulation of not to exceed \$50.

30 (c) The board shall take into consideration any felony conviction of
31 an applicant, but such conviction shall not automatically operate as a bar to
32 registration.

33 (d) *Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, each pharmacy*
34 *technician registration issued by the board shall expire* ~~on October 31 of~~
35 ~~the year specified by the board~~ *every two years. The expiration date shall*
36 *be established by rules and regulations adopted by the board. To provide*
37 *for a system of biennial renewal of pharmacy technician registrations, the*
38 *board may provide by rules and regulations that registrations issued or*
39 *renewed may expire less than two years from the date of issuance or*
40 *renewal. Each applicant for renewal of a pharmacy technician registration*
41 *shall be made on a form prescribed and furnished by the board and shall be*
42 *accompanied by a renewal fee fixed by the board by rule and regulation of*
43 *not to exceed \$25. Pharmacy technician registration renewal fees may be*

1 *prorated for registration periods which are less than biennial in*
2 *accordance with rules and regulations of the board.* Except as otherwise
3 provided in this subsection, the application for registration renewal, when
4 accompanied by the renewal fee and received by the executive secretary of
5 the board on or before the date of expiration of the registration, shall have
6 the effect of temporarily renewing the applicant's registration until actual
7 issuance or denial of the renewal registration. If at the time of filing a
8 proceeding is pending before the board which may result in the
9 suspension, probation, revocation or denial of the applicant's registration,
10 the board may by emergency order declare that the application for renewal
11 shall not have the effect of temporarily renewing such applicant's
12 registration. If the renewal fee is not paid ~~by December 1~~ *prior to the*
13 *expiration date* of the renewal year, the registration is void.

14 (e) (1) The board may limit, suspend or revoke a registration or deny
15 an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy
16 technician on any ground, which would authorize the board to take action
17 against the license of a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and
18 amendments thereto.

19 (2) The board may require a physical or mental examination, or both,
20 of a person applying for or registered as a pharmacy technician.

21 (3) The board may temporarily suspend or temporarily limit the
22 registration of any pharmacy technician in accordance with the emergency
23 adjudicative proceedings under the Kansas administrative procedure act if
24 the board determines that there is cause to believe that grounds exist for
25 disciplinary action under this section against the registrant and that the
26 registrant's continuation of pharmacy technician functions would constitute
27 an imminent danger to the public health and safety.

28 (4) Proceedings under this section shall be subject to the Kansas
29 administrative procedure act.

30 (f) Every registered pharmacy technician, within 30 days of obtaining
31 new employment, shall furnish the board's executive secretary notice of
32 the name and address of the new employer.

33 (g) Each pharmacy shall at all times maintain a list of the names of
34 pharmacy technicians employed by the pharmacy. A pharmacy technician
35 shall work under the direct supervision and control of a pharmacist. It shall
36 be the responsibility of the supervising pharmacist to determine that the
37 pharmacy technician is in compliance with the applicable rules and
38 regulations of the board, and the supervising pharmacist shall be
39 responsible for the acts and omissions of the pharmacy technician in the
40 performance of the pharmacy technician's duties. The ratio of pharmacy
41 technicians to pharmacists in the prescription area of a pharmacy shall be
42 prescribed by the board by rule and regulation. Any change in the ratio of
43 pharmacy technicians to pharmacists in the prescription area of the

1 pharmacy must be adopted by a vote of no less than six members of the
2 board.

3 (h) A person holding a pharmacy technician registration shall display
4 such registration in that part of the place of business in which such person
5 is engaged in pharmacy technician activities.

6 (i) The board shall adopt such rules and regulations as are necessary
7 to ensure that pharmacy technicians are adequately trained as to the nature
8 and scope of their lawful duties.

9 (j) The board may adopt rules and regulations as may be necessary to
10 carry out the purposes and enforce the provisions of this act.

11 (k) This section shall be part of and supplemental to the pharmacy act
12 of the state of Kansas.

13 New Sec. 6. (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to function as a
14 pharmacist intern in this state unless such person is registered with the
15 board as a pharmacist intern.

16 (b) All applications for registration shall be made on a form to be
17 prescribed and furnished by the board. Each application for registration
18 shall be accompanied by a registration fee fixed by the board by rule and
19 regulation not to exceed \$25.

20 (c) Each pharmacist intern registration issued by the board shall
21 expire six years from the date of issuance.

22 (d) (1) The board may limit, suspend or revoke a registration or deny
23 an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacist
24 intern on any ground that would authorize the board to take action against
25 the license of a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments
26 thereto.

27 (2) The board may temporarily suspend or temporarily limit the
28 registration of any pharmacist intern in accordance with the emergency
29 adjudicative proceedings under the Kansas administrative procedure act, if
30 the board determines that there is cause to believe that grounds exist for
31 disciplinary action under this section against the registrant and that the
32 registrant's continuation of pharmacist intern functions would constitute an
33 imminent danger to the public health and safety.

34 (3) Proceedings under this section shall be subject to the Kansas
35 administrative procedure act.

36 (e) Every registered pharmacist intern, within 30 days of obtaining
37 new employment, shall furnish the board's executive secretary notice of
38 the name and address of the new employer.

39 (f) Each pharmacy shall at all times maintain a list of the names of
40 pharmacist interns employed by the pharmacy. A pharmacist intern shall
41 work under the direct supervision and control of a pharmacist. It shall be
42 the responsibility of the supervising pharmacist to determine that the
43 pharmacist intern is in compliance with the applicable rules and

1 regulations of the board, and the supervising pharmacist shall be
2 responsible for the acts and omissions of the pharmacist intern in the
3 performance of the pharmacist intern's duties.

4 (g) A person holding a pharmacist intern registration shall display
5 such registration in that part of the place of business in which such person
6 is engaged in pharmacist intern activities.

7 (h) The board shall adopt such rules and regulations as are necessary
8 to ensure that pharmacist interns are adequately trained as to the nature
9 and scope of their lawful duties. The board may adopt rules and
10 regulations as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of and enforce
