AN ACT concerning law enforcement officers; relating to complaints.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) A member of the public who makes a complaint to a law enforcement agency against a law enforcement officer alleging misconduct on the part of the law enforcement officer shall be required to sign a sworn affidavit clearly stating the allegation. No law enforcement agency head or appointing authority shall take any disciplinary action against a law enforcement officer based on a complaint filed by a member of the public unless there is a sworn affidavit included with such complaint.

- (b) (1) A complaint made to a law enforcement agency against a law enforcement officer alleging misconduct on the part of the law enforcement officer shall include:
- (A) The location, including the county, where the alleged misconduct occurred;
 - (B) the date the alleged misconduct occurred;
 - $(C) \quad \text{a clear description of the alleged misconduct; and} \\$
 - (D) name and signature of the person making the complaint.
- (2) The form upon which a complaint is made shall include a statement advising the complainant that false complaints are subject to criminal prosecution for perjury.
- (c) (1) Upon the filing of a complaint with a law enforcement agency against a law enforcement officer, such officer shall be given a copy of the complaint and any evidence related to such complaint. Such officer shall be made fully aware of any facts related to the allegation contained in the complaint.
- (2) No law enforcement officer shall be required to make any oral or written statements regarding the complaint until such law enforcement officer has been made fully aware of any facts related to the allegation and received a copy of the complaint and any related evidence.
- 32 (d) If, during an investigation of a complaint, the investigating 33 authority finds:
 - (1) Any evidence that a crime was committed against a law enforcement officer, a copy of such evidence shall be submitted to the prosecuting authority; or

(2) clear evidence that such complaint is false, such investigation shall be closed immediately and the law enforcement agency shall seek criminal prosecution against the complainant for perjury.

- (e) (1) Upon request by a law enforcement officer, or such officer's authorized representative, such officer or representative shall be given a copy of all of the documents contained in such officer's complaint file within 14 calendar days of such request.
- (2) Nothing contained in a law enforcement officer's complaint file may be removed from such file or destroyed without written consent from the law enforcement officer.
- (3) Any complaint against a law enforcement officer determined to be false shall not be included in such officer's complaint file and shall not be used against such officer in any subsequent disciplinary proceeding or in any promotion decision.
 - (f) A law enforcement agency shall not:
- (1) Adopt any policy or regulation which prohibits the right of a law enforcement officer to file a lawsuit regarding a false complaint arising out of such officer's duties as a law enforcement officer;
- (2) investigate a complaint against a law enforcement officer for non-work related civil matters;
 - (3) open a separate investigation of a complaint if another agency has investigated such complaint and found no evidence of misconduct on the part of the law enforcement officer; or
 - (4) solicit a civilian to file a complaint against a law enforcement officer. Solicitation shall not be construed to mean any follow-up of a complaint.
 - (g) For the purposes of this section:
 - (1) "Law enforcement agency" means the governmental unit employing the law enforcement officer.
 - (2) "Law enforcement officer" has the meaning ascribed thereto in K.S.A. 74-5602, and amendments thereto, except law enforcement officer shall not include school security officers designated as school law enforcement officers pursuant to K.S.A. 72-8222, and amendments thereto.
- (h) Nothing contained in this section shall be construed to discourage legitimate complaints or prevent a law enforcement agency from investigating a complaint made against a law enforcement officer.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
