19 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

20 New Section 1. (a) On and after January 1, 2014, all primary  
21 elections for members of the governing body and other elected officials of  
22 any municipality shall be held on the first Tuesday in August of 2015 and  
23 on such date thereafter of odd-numbered years and all general elections for  
24 members of the governing body and other elected officials of any  
25 municipality shall be held on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in  
26 November of 2015 of odd-numbered years and on such date thereafter.

27 (b) The term of members of governing bodies and other elected  
28 officials that would expire at any time in 2015 shall expire on the second  
29 Monday in January 2016, when newly elected members of the governing  
30 body and other newly elected officials shall take office.

31 (c) Primary elections for any municipality shall be conducted as  
32 provided in K.S.A. 25-202, and amendments thereto.

33 (d) The filing deadline for all candidates for any municipality unless  
34 otherwise provided by law shall be as provided in K.S.A. 25-205, and  
35 amendments thereto.

36 (e) All elections for officers of municipalities shall be on a partisan

1 basis.

2 (f) "Municipality" means any city, consolidated city-county created  
3 under K.S.A. 12-340 et seq., and amendments thereto, and K.S.A. 2012  
4 Supp. 12-360 et seq., and amendments thereto, board of public utilities  
5 created under K.S.A. 13-1220 et seq., and amendments thereto, county  
6 adopting a charter under K.S.A. 19-2680 et seq., and amendments thereto,  
7 school district, community college, drainage district, extension district,  
8 irrigation district, library district created under K.S.A. 12-1236 et seq., and  
9 amendments thereto, and water districts created under K.S.A. 19-3501 et  
10 seq., and amendments thereto. The term does not include any municipality  
11 where the election of members of the governing body is conducted at a  
12 meeting of the municipality.

13 New Sec. 2. (a) Any city may adopt by ordinance one of the  
14 following forms of government:

15 (1) Commission;  
16 (2) mayor-council;  
17 (3) commission-manager;  
18 (4) mayor-council-manager;  
19 (5) council-manager; or  
20 (6) any other form of government authorized by law or by ordinance  
21 or charter ordinance of the city.

22 (b) Any city which has operated for four or more years under a form  
23 of government may abandon such form and adopt a different form of  
24 government. The provisions of K.S.A. 12-184, and amendments thereto,  
25 shall govern the procedure for the adoption or abandonment of such form  
26 of government.

27 (c) The governing body of the city may establish by ordinance any of  
28 the following:

29 (1) The powers and duties of the governing body, including the mayor  
30 and other elected officials;  
31 (2) the term of office of members of the governing body, including  
32 the mayor and other elected officials of either two or four years;  
33 (3) the election by ward or district of members of the governing body,  
34 if applicable;  
35 (4) the powers and duties of the city manager, if applicable;  
36 (5) the administrative departments of the city; and  
37 (6) other matters deemed appropriate by the governing body.

38 New Sec. 3. All existing ordinances and charter ordinances relating to  
39 a city's form of government, except those provisions relating to the timing  
40 of city primary and general elections, shall remain in effect until amended  
41 or repealed by such city.

42 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2-623 is hereby amended to read as follows: 2-623. (a)  
43 Prior to July 1 of any year, any two or more county extension councils may

1 establish an extension district composed of all of the counties of such  
2 councils by entering into an agreement in accordance with this section to  
3 combine the extension programs for each county involved into one  
4 extension program serving the extension district. No such agreement shall  
5 be effective unless such agreement has received the prior approval of: (1)  
6 The board of county commissioners of each county included in the  
7 proposed extension district, subject to the provisions of subsection (i); (2)  
8 the executive board of the extension council of each county included in the  
9 proposed extension district and the director of extension of Kansas state  
10 university of agriculture and applied science, or the director's authorized  
11 representative, acting together as a body; and (3) the attorney general in  
12 accordance with subsection (h).

13 (b) Prior to July 1 of any year, one or more county extension councils  
14 and the governing body of any existing extension district may establish a  
15 new extension district by entering into an agreement in accordance with  
16 this section to combine the extension programs for each such county and  
17 such district into one extension program serving a new extension district  
18 composed of all counties represented by such county extension councils  
19 and the area served by the existing extension district. No such agreement  
20 shall be effective unless such agreement has received the prior approval of:  
21 (1) The board of county commissioners of each county being added to the  
22 existing extension district, subject to the provisions of subsection (i); (2)  
23 the executive board of the county extension council of each county being  
24 added to the existing extension district, the governing body of the existing  
25 extension district and the director of extension of Kansas state university  
26 of agriculture and applied science, or the director's authorized  
27 representative, acting together as a body; and (3) the attorney general in  
28 accordance with subsection (h).

29 (c) On July 1 after the approval under subsection (a) or (b) of an  
30 agreement to establish an extension district, such extension district is  
31 hereby established and shall constitute a body corporate and politic  
32 possessing the usual powers of a corporation for public purposes under the  
33 name of "extension district no. \_\_\_\_\_ (the number designated by the  
34 director of extension), \_\_\_\_\_ counties (naming the counties included  
35 within the district), state of Kansas." Each extension district is a taxing  
36 subdivision and has the power to contract, sue and be sued and to acquire,  
37 hold and convey real and personal property in accordance with law.

38 (d) Upon the establishment of an extension district under subsection  
39 (a) or (b), all of the personnel and property of each of the extension  
40 programs which are combined into the new district extension programs  
41 shall be transferred to the new extension district and shall be subject to the  
42 authority of the governing body of the extension district in accordance  
43 with the agreement to establish the extension district.

1 (e) Upon the establishment of an extension district under subsection  
2 (a), the board of county commissioners of each county joining in the  
3 establishing of an extension district shall appoint four qualified electors to  
4 membership on the governing body of the district. The terms of all  
5 members so appointed shall commence on July 1 following their  
6 appointment. Of the members so appointed two members shall serve for  
7 terms ending upon the election and qualification of their successors at an  
8 election held on the ~~first Tuesday in April of the first odd-numbered year~~  
9 ~~following their appointment and two members shall serve for terms ending~~  
10 ~~upon the election and qualification of their successors at an election held~~  
11 ~~on the first Tuesday in April of the second odd-numbered year following~~  
12 ~~their appointment following the first Monday in November of the first odd-~~  
13 ~~numbered year following their appointment and two members shall serve~~  
14 ~~for terms ending upon the election and qualification of their successors at~~  
15 ~~an election held on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November~~  
16 ~~of the second odd-numbered year following their appointment.~~

17 (f) *A primary election shall be held on the first Tuesday in August in*  
18 *accordance with K.S.A. 25-202, and amendments thereto.*

19 (†) (g) In the case of one or more counties being included in an  
20 existing extension district under subsection (b), the board of county  
21 commissioners of each county being included in an existing extension  
22 district shall appoint four qualified electors of the county to membership  
23 on the governing body of the expanded district. The terms of all members  
24 so appointed shall commence on July 1 following their appointment. Of  
25 the members so appointed two members shall serve for terms ending upon  
26 the election and qualification of their successors at an election held on the  
27 ~~first Tuesday in April of the first odd-numbered year following their~~  
28 ~~appointment and two members shall serve for terms ending upon the~~  
29 ~~election and qualification of their successors at an election held on the first~~  
30 ~~Tuesday in April of the second odd-numbered year following their~~  
31 ~~appointment Tuesday following the first Monday in November of the first~~  
32 ~~odd-numbered year following their appointment and two members shall~~  
33 ~~serve for terms ending upon the election and qualification of their~~

41 (‡) (h) In addition to other required provisions, each agreement  
42 entered into under this section shall specify the permissible method or  
43 methods to be employed in disposing of the assets and liabilities of the

1 extension district in the event that one or more counties withdraw from the  
2 extension district under K.S.A. 2-628, and amendments thereto.

3 ~~(h)~~ (i) Each agreement entered into under this section or under K.S.A.  
4 2-628, and amendments thereto, prior to and as a condition precedent to its  
5 entry into force, shall be submitted to the attorney general who shall  
6 determine whether the agreement is in proper form and compatible with  
7 this act and the other laws of Kansas. The attorney general shall approve  
8 any agreement submitted for approval under this section or K.S.A. 2-628,  
9 and amendments thereto, unless the attorney general finds that the  
10 submitted agreement does not meet the requirements of this act. In such  
11 case, the attorney general shall specify in writing to the proposed parties to  
12 the agreement and to each other entity required to approve the agreement,  
13 the specific respects in which the proposed agreement fails to meet the  
14 requirements of law. Failure by the attorney general to disapprove an  
15 agreement submitted pursuant to this subsection within 90 days of its  
16 submission shall constitute approval of the agreement by the attorney  
17 general.

18 ~~(h)~~ (j) Prior to approving an agreement under this section, the board of  
19 county commissioners of each county to be included in a proposed  
20 extension district under subsection (a) or to be added to an existing  
21 extension district under subsection (b), as the case may be, shall adopt a  
22 resolution stating the intention of the board of county commissioners to  
23 approve such agreement and specifying the counties that are to be included  
24 in the extension district. Such resolution shall be published once each  
25 week for two consecutive weeks in the official county newspaper. If,  
26 within 60 days following the last publication of the resolution, a petition in  
27 opposition to the approval of the agreement and the inclusion of the county  
28 in the extension district is signed by not less than 5% of the qualified  
29 electors of the county and is filed with the county election officer, such  
30 board of county commissioners shall not approve such agreement and the  
31 county shall not be included in the extension district unless and until the  
32 same is approved by a majority of the qualified electors of the county  
33 voting thereon at a primary election or general election or at a special  
34 election called and held for such purpose. Any such special election shall  
35 be called, noticed and held in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 10-  
36 120, and amendments thereto.

37 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 2-624 is hereby amended to read as  
38 follows: 2-624. (a) The governing body of each extension district shall be  
39 composed of four representatives from each county included in the  
40 extension district. At the conclusion of the terms of the members first  
41 appointed to membership on the governing body of the district, the four  
42 members representing each county in an extension district shall be elected  
43 in a county-wide election by the qualified electors of the county.

1 (b) At the conclusion of the terms of the members first appointed to  
2 membership on the governing body of the district, each member of the  
3 governing body shall hold office for a term of four years and until such  
4 member's successor is elected and qualified. Each such term of office shall  
5 commence on the date of receipt of certification of election by the member  
6 elected and shall continue until the member's successor is elected and  
7 qualified.

8 (c) (1) ~~Except as otherwise provided in this act, an~~ *A primary shall be*  
9 *held on the first Tuesday in August in accordance with K.S.A. 25-202, and*  
10 *amendments thereto. The general election to elect successors to members*  
11 *of the governing body whose terms are expiring shall be held on the first*  
12 *Tuesday in April in each odd-numbered year.*

13 (2) Elections to choose members of the governing body of an  
14 extension district shall be conducted, the returns made and the results  
15 ascertained in the manner provided by law for general county elections  
16 except as otherwise provided by this act. ~~Not later than 12 noon of the~~  
17 ~~Tuesday, 10 weeks preceding the first Tuesday in April in election years,~~  
18 ~~each person desiring to be a candidate for membership on the governing~~  
19 ~~body, in any election, shall file a declaration of candidacy, accompanied by~~  
20 ~~a filing fee of \$5, with the county election officer of the county represented~~  
21 ~~by the member of the governing body whose successor is to be elected, as~~  
22 ~~a candidate in such election. The county election officer shall remit such~~  
23 ~~filing fees to the county treasurer for deposit in the county general fund.~~  
24 ~~The county election officer in making up the ballots and in placing the~~  
25 ~~names thereon shall place the names on the ballots in alphabetical order~~  
26 *Any person desiring to be a candidate for election to the governing body*  
27 *shall file a candidate's declaration of intention with the county election*  
28 *officer of the county represented by the member of the governing body*  
29 *whose successor is to be elected. Such candidate's filing shall be made as*  
30 *provided in K.S.A. 25-205, and amendments thereto.*

31 (3) The county election officer of each county within the extension  
32 district shall appoint election boards as provided by law for other elections  
33 and shall designate places for holding the election. The county election  
34 officer shall cause to be ascertained the names of all persons within the  
35 district who are qualified electors, and shall furnish lists thereof to the  
36 judges of the election. Notice of the time and place of holding each  
37 ~~general and primary election, signed by the county election officer, shall~~  
38 ~~be given in a newspaper published in the county and posted in a~~  
39 ~~conspicuous place in the office of the governing body at least five days~~  
40 ~~before the holding thereof shall be published by the county election officer~~  
41 ~~in a newspaper published in the county in accordance with K.S.A. 25-209,~~  
42 ~~and amendments thereto, and K.S.A. 25-105, and amendments thereto.~~

43 (4) All election expenses shall be paid by the extension district.

1 Election officials shall receive the same compensation as provided under  
2 the general election laws.

3 (d) Any vacancy in the membership of the governing body of an  
4 extension district shall be filled by appointment by the governing body for  
5 the unexpired term of office. Each member so appointed shall be a resident  
6 of the county which was represented by the member creating the vacancy.

7 (e) The governing body of each extension district shall organize  
8 annually in July by electing from among its members a chairperson, vice-  
9 chairperson, secretary and treasurer.

11 (a) Any plan submitted by the commission shall provide for the exercise of  
12 powers of local legislation and administration not inconsistent with the  
13 constitution or other laws of this state.

14 (b) If the commission submits a plan providing for the consolidation  
15 of certain city and county offices, functions, services and operations, the  
16 plan shall:

17 (1) Include a description of the form, structure, functions, powers and  
18 officers and the duties of such officers recommended in the plan.

19 (2) Provide for the method of amendment of the plan.

20 (3) Authorize the appointment of, or elimination of elective officials  
21 and offices.

22 (4) Specify the effective date of the consolidation.

3       Sec. 7. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 12-363 is hereby amended to read as  
 4 follows: 12-363. (a) Any plan submitted by the commission shall provide  
 5 for the exercise of powers of local legislation and administration not  
 6 inconsistent with the constitution or other laws of this state.

7       (b) If the commission submits a plan providing for the unification of  
 8 certain city and county offices, functions, services and operations, the plan  
 9 shall:

10       (1) Include a description of the form, structure, functions, powers and  
 11 officers and the duties of such officers recommended in the plan.

12       (2) Provide for the method of amendment of the plan.

13       (3) Specify the effective date of the unification.

14       (4) Include other provisions determined necessary by the  
 15 commission.

16       (c) If the plan provides for the unification of the city and county, in  
 17 addition to the requirements of subsection (b) the plan shall:

 35 *be on a partisan basis.*

36       Sec. 8. K.S.A. 13-1220 is hereby amended to read as follows: 13-  
 37 1220. ~~In each city of the first class that now has or hereafter acquires a~~  
 38 ~~population of more than one hundred thousand inhabitants, which now or~~  
 39 ~~hereafter owns and operates a municipal waterworks plant and a municipal~~  
 40 ~~electric light plant, there shall be~~ *Any city may establish* an administrative  
 41 agency known as the board of public utilities of such city, to be elected in  
 42 the manner hereinafter provided. The board shall manage, operate,  
 43 maintain and control the daily operation of the water plant and electric-



1 light plant of such city, and shall make all such rules and regulations as are  
2 necessary for the safe, economical and efficient operation and management  
3 of such water plants and electric-light plants. The board may also improve,  
4 extend or enlarge the water plants and electric-light plants as hereinafter  
5 provided, and furnish a supply of water, light, heat and power for  
6 domestic, industrial and municipal purposes.

7 Sec. 9. K.S.A. 13-1221 is hereby amended to read as follows: 13-  
8 1221. (a) The board of public utilities shall consist of six members, three  
9 of which shall be nominated and elected by the city at large and three of  
10 which shall be elected by the qualified electors of the city within each of  
11 the districts established pursuant to subsection (b). *Members of the board*  
12 *shall be elected on a partisan basis.* Members elected to the board of  
13 public utilities after the effective date of this act shall hold their offices for  
14 terms of four years, and until their successors are elected and qualified.  
15 Each of the members elected from districts shall be qualified voters of the  
16 districts from which elected. Elections of members of the board shall be  
17 held at the time of the general city election. The provisions of article 17 of  
18 chapter 13 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, *and amendments thereto*,  
19 pertaining to the election and removal of officers, shall govern so far as  
20 applicable.

21 The board shall elect from its own number a president and vice-  
22 president and shall appoint a secretary. Notwithstanding the provisions of  
23 K.S.A. 13-1222, *and amendments thereto*, relating to a quorum for the  
24 transaction of business and a vote for action by the board, any vacancy  
25 occurring in the board shall be filled by a majority vote of the members  
26 remaining on the board. Where a vacancy has occurred in the membership  
27 of any board of public utilities, a member selected to fill such vacancy  
28 shall serve until the next city election, at which time a successor shall be  
29 elected to serve the remainder of the unexpired term, if any.

30 (b) The districts numbered 1, 2 and 3 established in 1979 shall be  
31 subject to alteration at the first meeting of the board in each fourth year  
32 thereafter, but such alteration shall only be for the purpose of establishing  
33 and maintaining the equality of population among the districts.

34 Sec. 10. K.S.A. 19-2680 is hereby amended to read as follows: 19-  
35 2680. (a) Any county which has been declared to be an urban area under  
36 the provisions of K.S.A. 19-2654, *and amendments thereto*, is hereby  
37 authorized to adopt, and from time to time amend, a charter for the  
38 government of such county. Such charter shall provide for the exercise of  
39 powers of local legislation and administration not inconsistent with general  
40 law or the constitution of the state of Kansas, and may:

41 ~~(a)~~ (1) Fix the boundaries of each county commissioner's district,  
42 provide a method for changing them from time to time, and fix the  
43 number, term, and compensation of the commissioners and their method of

1 election, and shall define and outline duties and powers of the county  
2 commissioners;

3 ~~(b)~~ (2) provide for the exercise of such powers similar or identical to  
4 the powers permitted under K.S.A. 19-101 and article 39 of chapter 12 of  
5 the Kansas Statutes Annotated, *and amendments thereto*;

6 ~~(c)~~ (3) provide in the charter a method for its amendment;

7 ~~(d)~~ (4) determine the distribution of legislative and administrative  
8 duties of the county officials, provide for consolidation or expansion of  
9 services as necessary, authorize the appointment of a county administrator  
10 or a county manager, and prescribe the general structure of county  
11 government; and

12 ~~(e)~~ (5) authorize the appointment of or elimination of elective  
13 officials and offices within the charter similar or identical to that  
14 authorization permitted the board of county commissioners under article  
15 39 of chapter 12 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, *and amendments*  
16 *thereto*.

17 *(b) Elections for the governing body and other elected officers shall*  
18 *be on a partisan basis.*

19 Sec. 11. K.S.A. 19-3505 is hereby amended to read as follows: 19-  
20 3505. (a) Except as otherwise provided by this section, the governing body  
21 of any water district to which this section applies shall be a five-member  
22 board holding positions numbered one to five, inclusive. Each member  
23 shall be elected and shall hold office from ~~May 1 following such member's~~  
24 ~~election until April 30~~, *the second Monday in January succeeding such*  
25 *member's election until* four years thereafter and until a successor is  
26 elected and has qualified.

27 The first election of members of the governing body of any water  
28 district created after the effective date of this act shall be held on the first  
29 Tuesday in August of any even-numbered year, at which time members  
30 shall be elected for terms beginning on September 1 of the same year, and  
31 ending on April 30 of the third year following the beginning of such term,  
32 to positions numbered three, four and five. At such first election, members  
33 shall be elected for terms ending on April 30 of the first year following the  
34 beginning of such terms, to positions numbered one and two. Members  
35 first elected to positions one and two shall have terms of approximately  
36 eight months. Elections shall be ~~thereafter~~ held on the ~~first Tuesday in~~  
37 ~~April~~ of each odd-numbered year *following the first Monday in November*  
38 for the member positions whose terms expire in that year.
