SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2144

As Recommended by House Committee on Judiciary

Brief*

HB 2144 would repeal outdated statutes concerning juveniles. Specifically, it would remove an Open Records Act exception found in KSA 38-1664 concerning confidential reports of foster parents summarizing the adjustment, progress and condition of a juvenile offender placed in the foster parent's home. It also would repeal KSA 38-1604, concerning jurisdiction and placement of juvenile offenders with the Department for Children and Families or the Juvenile Justice Authority, and KSA 38-1608, concerning records of certain juveniles in the possession of law enforcement and municipal courts.

Background

No proponents or opponents offered testimony in the House Committee on Judiciary.

The Division of the Budget's fiscal note indicates passage would have no fiscal effect.
