Chairman Highland asked for bill introductions; there were none.

<u>Hearing on: HB2028 — Creating the Kansas education standards study commission.</u>

The Chairman opened the hearing on **HB2028** and asked Tamera Lawrence to give members an overview of the bill. Ms. Lawrence answered questions from the committee.

Chairman Highland invited Dave Trabert to address members on <u>HB2028</u>. Mr. Trabert gave support for the bill, acknowledging school districts do not know how to define the Rose standards and are concerned that there be a clear, measurable definition. He recognized the efforts being made by the Kansas Department of Education (KSDE) to define the Rose standards and encouraged legislators to take an active role in determining how the standards are interpreted and measured. Mark Tallman informed members of the efforts made by his organization in developing recommendations for implementing the Rose Standards, stating that KASB members believe **HB2028** is a step toward seeing that students have what they need to be successful adults and toward our economy having what it needs to thrive.
