## Possible action on bills previously heard

Chairman Highland opened the meeting and made announcements related to this meeting being the final committee meeting scheduled for the 2016 session.

Opening the meeting for discussion on Substitute for HB 2292 - Development and establishment of K-12 curriculum standards, Chairman Highland asked for a motion on the bill. Representative Hedke moved and Representative Hutchins seconded Substitute for HB2292 be passed out of committee favorably.

Representative Grosserode offered a balloon amendment for a substitute bill commenting the amendment was offered as a conceptual amendment because she recognized the language needed work. Chairman Highland asked Nick Myers to explain the amendment. <u>Representative Grosserode moved the substitute for Substitute for HB2292 be adopted; Representative Hutchins seconded the motion to amend. (Attachment 1)</u>

Discussion took place on the substitute bill. As part of her comments on the substitute bill, Representative Winn offered a handout of information on the effects of Substitute for <u>HB2292</u>. (Attachment 2)

Discussion continued on the substitute bill with suggestions being made on changes to the original language of the amendment. Representative Bruchman asked for an update on the current status of the amendment language. Chairman Highland asked Nick Myers to read the suggested language for the

amendment, and then asked Representative Grosserode if she agreed with the changes made to the language; the Representative indicated she found the new language to be preferable to the original language. Discussion continued on the new language. Representative Grosserode asked that language be added that would make new curriculum standards subject to legislative review. Discussion continued on the language of the amendment. Representative Rhoades requested that language specifically naming Common Core state standards be included in the substitute bill language. Representative Grosserode moved her motion to amend.

The Chairman asked Mr. Myers to read the language of the amendment prior a vote. The language of the substitute bill for Substitute for **HB2292** as agreed to by Representative Grosserode was read as follows:

"No Kansas curriculum standards shall be formed by adopting a federally provided or required set of educational standards or by adopting the Common Core state standards. Any such federal standards or Common Core state standards previously adopted are hereby repealed on July 1, 2017. The Kansas State Board of Education shall establish new standards to meet the provisions of the above section on or before July 1, 2017, and the Kansas State Board of Education shall provide the standards adopted pursuant to that section to the legislature for review prior to implementation of the standards."

The Chairman was in doubt on the voice vote to adopt the substitute for Substitute for HB2292. The motion to adopt the substitute bill passed 10 to 7 on a vote by show of hands.

Those members desiring to have their vote against the adoption of the substitute bill were:

The Chairman stated the meeting was adjoured, but after consultation with staff, the Chairman recognized the motion to pass the bill out of committee favorably had not received a vote; he called members back to their places to resume the meeting.

On the vote to pass Substitute for Substitute for <u>HB2292</u> out of committee favorably, division was called. *The motion to pass the bill out favorably passed 10 to 7 on a vote by show of hands.*
