Testimony Proponent HB 2292

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This is my third year of testimony for a bill which would rid Kansas of the Common Core Standards, and hopefully this is my last. The first year I came to you all I was the only parent to testify. Last year there were nearly 200 parents that filled the lobby to let you know their distaste for the common core. This Parent led movement against the common core is only growing! I receive emails daily from parents asking what they can do to relieve their children of the crying that happens each night at the kitchen table as they do the math homework together.

From Inception this education reform was a violation of our 10th amendment right for the state to have control over their own education. I have attached a legislative authority memo that states why the Kansas legislature has authority to take control of the states education standards. I have also attached copies of homework problems for an average 4th grader that show the deliberately confusing and inappropriate nature of the common core, that ask questions far above their level of thinking.

On the flipside of this I would like to add that these standards are not rigorous enough as they move into the high school and do not prepare our children to be "college ready". The math standards put us two years behind the high performing countries like China and Singapore, and do not reach a calculus class. The reading standards cut out half of the classic literature which is where children develop rich vocabulary and moral aptitude by reading about a hero's strife through good and evil.

This Parent led movement is only getting larger and other states across the country are rethinking and pulling away from the standards. Please vote to regain local control of education in Kansas by supporting HB2292.
