To the Honorable Ron Highland, Chair of the Education Committee:

I am writing to strongly urge you to expel Common Core from the State of Kansas.

The federal government's attempt to control public education in the form of Common Core is having dismal results. Our children are not one size fits all"! That is the approach that Common Core takes. The program removes any ad all local control. It does not breed an atmosphere conducive to learning, nor does it make room for diversity in culture, special needs children, advanced children, or needs that are unique to Kansas itself.

Re-establish local control of education in Kansas.

Prevent Kansas from ceding any control to entities not allowed authority over Kansas education as per Article 6 of the Kansas Constitution.

Make no mistake, we are doing our children a great disservice by keeping the Common Core program in place. It is basically dumbing them down, stifling creativity, making a mockery of quality education.

Please rid us of this Common Core program.
