What do the Reports Mean?

Ability Scores

Ability scores are used to tell you how your child performed on the ISIP assessment. Like measuring your child's height with a ruler, the ability score measures a student's reading growth over time. As your child's reading ability improves, the ability score increases in number. Instructional Tiers

The goal of ISIP is to identify children at risk of reading difficulties. Instructional tiers are used to identify your child's level of risk. His or her ability scores are used to place him or her within an instructional tier. The criterion for determining tiers becomes progressively more difficult over the school year.

- . Tier 1: Performing at grade level
- Tier 2: Performing moderately below grade level and in need of intervention
- Tier 3: Performing seriously below grade level and in need of intensive intervention


Your student is currently working in Cycle 7.

Istation Reading is organized into sequential cycles of reading instruction from Foundations to Reading Cycle 14. Your child is placed in the cycle that is appropriate for his or her learning based on his or her performance on the ISIP assessment.

Istation's reading intervention includes reading instruction across grades. The instruction in a cycle does not focus on skills for a single grade level but is focused on the skills your child needs to improve reading growth.

Suggested/Addivities for Vocabulary Cards



All suggested activities can be done with just you and your child. You can involve more members of the family to make the activity fun for the whole family.

Vocabulary cards should be printed from your computer and cut out for use in suggested activities. Paper and pencil may be needed for some of the suggested activities.

Draw three vocabulary cards and show them to your child. Have your child read them aloud and then make a sentence with all three words. Your child can either share the sentences orally or write the sentences on paper. If desired, you can direct your child to make sentences that are silly, serious, mysterious, unbelievable, short, long, descriptive, etc.

Part of Speech Sort

Select a variety of words from the vocabulary cards for the cycle your child is working in. Have your child sort vocabulary cards by part of speech. If your child is unfamiliar with parts of speech, direct him or her to sort by people, places, things, actions, descriptions, etc.

Compound Word Silds (for cycles 7=10 voæbulary cards)

Select compound words (words made from two words, such as mailman) from cycles 7–10 vocabulary cards, and place the cards in a pile. Have your child draw a card, place a toothpick between the two words, and then say the word out loud. If your child has correctly divided and read the word, he or she gets to keep the card. If not, the card is placed back in the word pile, and play resumes with the drawing of another card.

Syllable Clap (for cycles 7-

Select compound words and/or multisyllabic words (wor vocabulary cards, and place the cards in a pile. Have your repeat the word, this time clapping to illustrate each sylla clapped out each syllable, he or she gets to keep the card play resumes with the drawing of another card.



Reading Words Containing ar



What You Need

- a printed copy of "Lowercase Letter Cards: Cycles 1–7"
- a pair of scissors
- a printed copy of "Sketch It: Bossy R"
- · a piece of paper and a writing utensil (optional)

Note: Words in bold are said aloud by the parent.

- Use the scissors to cut out the cards on the copy of "Lowercase Letter Cards: Cycles 1–7."
- Show the r letter card. When we see the letter r, we say "/r/." Listen and repeat after me: /r/. Have your child repeat after you.
- Use the letter cards to form ra. When we see the letters ra, we say "/ra/" as in ran. Listen and repeat
 after me: ra. Have your child repeat after you.
- Use the letter cards to form ar. When we see the letters ar, we say "/ar/" as in arm. Listen and repeat
 after me: ar. Have your child repeat after you. We call the r in ar the Bossy R because it changes the
 vowel sound. Listen to how the sound of the a changes in ran and arm: ran, arm. When the letter r
 follows the vowel a, it is a Bossy R.
- Use the letter cards to form the word arm. Sound out the word with your child. (Touch ar and say "/ar/."
 Then touch the m and say "/m/.") Blend the sounds faster and faster until the word is heard. What is this word? Allow your child to respond. Provide corrective and positive feedback as needed. Repeat this activity with the following words: art, car, farm, and star.
- Use the letter cards to form ar. What are these two letters? Allow your child to respond. Provide
 corrective and positive feedback as needed. Which letter is first? Allow your child to respond. Provide
 corrective and positive feedback as needed. Which letter is last? Allow your child to respond. Provide
 corrective and positive feedback as needed. What sound do these letters make? Allow your child to
 respond. Provide corrective and positive feedback as needed.
- Use the letter cards to form rat. What is this word? Allow your child to respond. Provide corrective and
 positive feedback as needed. Does this word have a Bossy R? Allow your child to respond. Provide
 corrective and positive feedback as needed. There is no Bossy R here. The Bossy R is in ar, not ra.




- Use the letter cards to form the word ark. Does this word have a Bossy R? Allow your child to respond. Provide corrective and positive feedback as needed. Sound out the word with your child. Touch the letters and say the sounds in unison with your child. Blend the sounds faster and faster until the word is heard. What is this word? Allow your child to respond. Provide corrective and positive feedback as needed. Repeat this activity with the following words: car, cart, bar, ran, far, card, dark, raft, farm, mark, and star. Notice that some words have the Bossy R and some don't.
- Now you get to have some fun drawing pictures. Give your child "Sketch It: Bossy R." Read each word.
 For each word, draw a picture in the box to match it. While your child is drawing, have your child read the ar words to you. Note the progress of your child. Use the information to plan for future practice and instruction.


