Chairman Waymaster opened the hearing on <u>**HB 2148**</u> on Friday, February 13, 2015 at 1:30 p.m. . Jill Wolters, staff revisor, reviewed the bill and the fiscal note. (Attachment 1)

Rep. Clayton testified in support of <u>HB 2148</u> stating that Kansas should be a leader in bringing the government to the people. (Attachment 2)

Rep. Hineman provided comments in support of <u>HB 2148</u> stating that committees were where the decision making takes place.
