Kansas Medicaid Expansion Testimony From Randy Conyers, Author of *Mott's Mind* Shady Brook Farms, 25 Scottsdale, Wichita, KS

Mr. Chairman and Committee Members;

I have much gratitude for the committee allowing me to testify in writing, regarding the acceptance of Medicaid Expansion in the great state of Kansas.
