

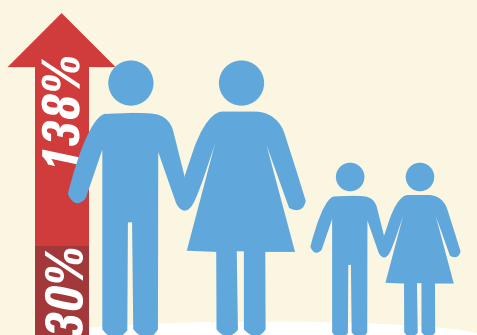

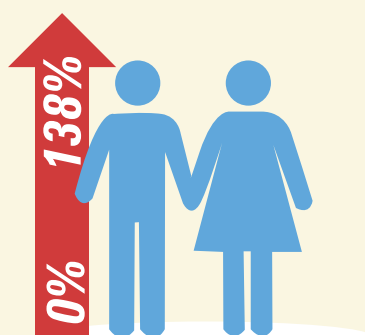
In June 2012, the U.S. Supreme Court left it up to states to decide whether to expand their Medicaid programs.

Income Eligibility Limits Increase

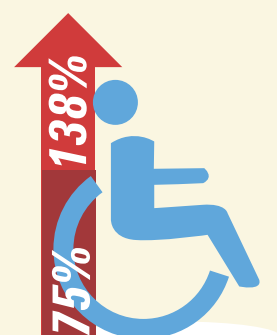
Current KanCare federal poverty line and where it would expand to under Medicaid Expansion



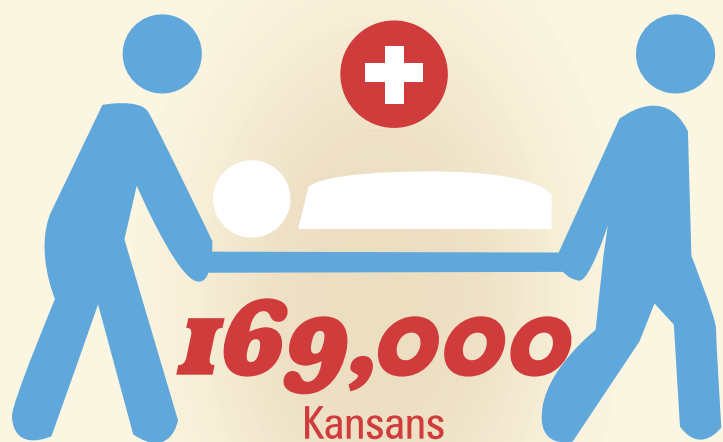

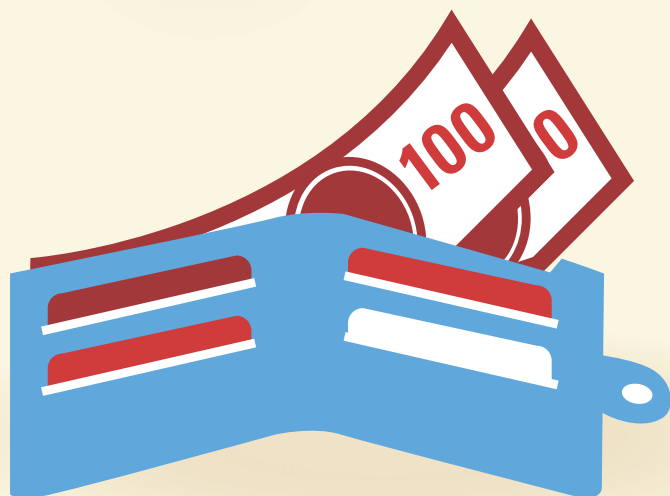
