<u>Hearing on: SB34 — Penalties for voting crimes; prosecution of election crimes.</u>

Chairperson Barker opened the hearing on <u>SB34</u>. A review of the bill was given by Katherine Goyette, Office of Revisor of Statutes. Representative John Carmichael had questions regarding some of the language in the bill and what effect it has on the prosecutor's burden to establish the crime and regarding the penalties involved. Discussion followed by Representatives Steven Becker and John Rubin.

Chairperson Barker recognized Kris Kobach, Secretary of State, as a proponent of <u>SB34</u> (<u>Attachment 1</u>). He handed out an interstate cross-check chart showing the incidences of people being registered to vote in multiple states (<u>Attachment 2</u>). Chairperson Barker called upon Stephen Howe on behalf of the Kansas County and District Attorneys Association who testified as an opponent to **SB34 (Attachment 3)**.
