Chairperson Barker called a meeting at the rail at 11:45 a.m. He stated that there were three bills that needed action.

SB11 - Regulated scrap metal; crime of theft and related sentencing provisions; regulation of scrap metal dealers, including unlawful acts and penalties

Chairperson Barker stated that the first bill for consideration is **SB11**. He called for the pleasure of the committee.
