Chairperson Barker recognized Phil Cosby, on behalf of the American Family Action of Kansas and Missouri as a proponent (Attachment 3). Questions were asked by Representatives Jim Ward and John Carmichael.

Suzanne Wickerd was then recognized by Chairperson Barker as a proponent of **SB56** (Attachment 4).

Additional questions were asked of proponent Phil Cosby by Representatives John Rubin, Charles Macheers, and Jim Ward.

Chairperson Barker called upon Thomas Witt of Equality Kansas who testified as an opponent to **SB56** (Attachment 5). Questions were asked by Representatives Becky Hutchins and Mark Kahrs.

# Briefing by staff on: HB2147 — Amending the protection from abuse act and protection from stalking act to establish the protection from stalking and sexual assault act.

<u>Representative Charles Macheers moved to recommend SB17 favorably for passage, seconded by Representative John Whitmer.</u>

amendment changes the appointment process for members of the Judicial Council so that it will consist of legislative representatives, gubernatorial representatives, and court representatives.

At Chairperson Barker's request, Jason Thompson, Revisor, explained the details of the amendment. Questions were asked by Representatives John Carmichael, Steve Alford, Mark Kahrs, and John Whitmer.

Representative Craig McPherson moved to amend SB17, seconded by Representative Kyle Hoffman.

Chairperson Barker called for discussion. Representative John Carmichael stated that he opposes this amendment because it does something different than the bill. The bill puts additional legislators on the Judicial Council, which makes good sense. It also makes good sense for the Supreme Court to appoint people to the Judicial Council who are knowledgeable lawyers, not political cronies or friends of the Governor. This amendment, however, turns the Judicial Council into political appointees of the Governor

Representative Annie Kuether also opposes the amendment because it politicizes an organization that should not be politicized.

Representative Dennis Highberger sees no need for the amendment, and he agrees it politicizes another agency of the government.

Chairperson Barker stated that he first served on the Judicial Council in 1989, and it is probably the least political group you will ever meet. They are appointed based upon their expertise in the law in certain areas.

Representative Craig McPherson closed on his motion to amend **SB17**. A vote was taken, and the Chairperson stated that the ayes had it. Division was called by Representative John Carmichael. A vote was taken by a showing of hands. There were eleven in favor of the motion to amend and seven opposed. The amendment to **SB17** passed.

<u>Representative Jim Ward moved to amend **SB1**7 by adding the ranking minority members of both the Senate and the House Judiciary Committees to the Judicial Council, seconded by Representative Dennis Highberger.</u>

Representatives John Whitmer, Mark Kahrs, Dennis Highberger, and Kyle Hoffman had questions and comments about the proposed amendment.

Chairperson Barker asked if there was further discussion. Seeing none, he advised Representative Jim Ward he could close on the motion.

Representative Jim Ward closed by stating that the amendment does not politicize the bill. It diversifies

<u>Vice-Chairperson Charles Macheers moved to recommend SB17, as amended, favorably for passage, seconded by Representative Mark Kahrs. A vote was taken, and it was the opinion of the Chair that the ayes had it. Division was called by Representative John Carmichael. A vote was taken by a show of hands. There were thirteen votes in favor and five votes against the passage of SB17, as amended.</u>
<u>SB17, as amended, was favorably passed.</u>
