You asked me to clarify how the protective order information would be provided to a judge in a domestic battery case. As you know, most of the protective orders listed in the bill are considered confidential. The information would be reported to the court on a confidential page of the presentence report. The confidential pages are provided to the judge, prosecutor and defense counsel; they are not filed in the official clerks file. In discussing how to present the current or prior protective orders to the court, we have considered developing a form similar to the current criminal history worksheet (copy attached) which would detail:

- Source of information – NCIC record, court record, defendant, victim
- Case type – Divorce, child in need of care, criminal
- Order type – temporary PFA, final order PFA, bond condition, supervision condition,

Nancy Strouse and I can be available to provide additional information to the committee if necessary.
