### Who is included in this report?

- All retirees reported to the actuary for the 12/31/2013 actuarial valuation
- KPERS Members (Judges and KP&F are excluded)
- Only members (Joint Annuitants, Survivors, Beneficiaries, etc. are excluded)
- Normal Retirements (Early retirements, disability, etc. are excluded)
- Working After Retirement participants since 2009, when the special exemption for licensed school personnel was implemented
- If a retiree returned to work in more than one year, they were only counted once and classified in the position from the most recent year
- This information should be considered a best estimate as the data is unaudited























### Percent of Retirements by Retirement Age Retirees Reported to the Actuary Working After Retirement in any year between 2009 and 2013









### **All KPERS Retirees**

- KPERS retiree population The number of KPERS retirees returning to work is small relative to the entire
- entire KPERS retiree population slightly younger However, the younger average age of retirement among working after retirement participants does move the distribution of age at retirement for the
- assumptions there will be a cost to the System To the extent that actual retirement experience differs from actuarial
- Even with this additional information, it is not possible to accurately calculate a contribution rate that would cover the cost to the System
