# HB2085 - Contracts between the secretary of transportation and the Kansas turnpike authority; annual reports from the authority; director of operations

Staff explained that this bill would designate the Secretary of Transportation as the director of the KTA, and remove a July 1, 2016 sunset on the Secretary being in that position. The bill would also change a KTA reporting requirement for the KTA's annual report for the preceding calendar year to require the report to cover the preceding fiscal year. Staff responded to questions.

Vice-Chairman Ryckman called for questions or motions. <u>Representative Lusker moved to favorably</u> pass this bill from Committee, seconded by Representative Rooker. Motion carried.

Final Action on <u>HB2188 - Driver's licenses</u>; requiring entering into a payment plan for certain individuals to receive restricted driving privileges when license has expired while on suspension.
