Chairman Proehl opened the meeting and advised the Members that the Department of Revenue brought examples of the digital license plates that were discussed in the presentation last week.

<u>Hearing on: SB373 — Driver's license operation of vehicle with temporary registration.</u> Staff explained the bill.

The Chairman recognized Ed Klumpp. (Attachment 1) According to Mr. Klumpp, this bill is a technical fix to KSA 8-235 changing the reference to a "temporary thirty-day permit" to a "temporary 60-day permit." In summary **SB373** would amend a driver's license statute to reflect changes made in 2012 that extended temporary registration permits for vehicles from 30 days to 60 days.

closed the hearing on **SB373** and opened the hearing on **SB382**.

Hearing on: SB382 — Repealing requirement that wrecker and towing service providers file notices, publications and affidavits with the county clerk.

Staff explained the bill.

Chairman Proehl recognized Tom Whitaker as the first Proponent. (Attachment 2) This bill would repeal a requirement that a person providing wrecker or towing service file certain notices, publications, and affidavits with the county clerk prior to the sale at public auction of any abandoned or disabled motor vehicle.
