In Opposition to House Bill No. 2450

MR. CHAIRMAN AND MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE:

I am Tom Whitaker, executive director of the Kansas Motor Carriers Association. I appear here this afternoon representing our 950 member companies and the Kansas trucking industry in opposition to HB 2450 which will increase the speed limit to 80 miles-per-hour on certain separated multilane highways.

KMCA supports uniform speed limits on Kansas highways and strict enforcement of such speed limit. While HB 2450 does provide for a uniform speed limit on certain separated multilane highways, the bill does not eliminate the current "speed limit buffer" found in Sections 2 and 3 of the bill. Kansas currently has a de facto 85 mph speed limit on certain separated multilane highways. Speeding violations not in excess of 10 mph are not reported to the Division of Vehicle, are not considered as a moving violation and cannot be used in determining the rate charged for an automobile liability insurance policy or whether to cancel such policy.

If the Committee decides to advance HB 2450, KMCA respectfully requests Section 2 and 3 be repealed. We thank you for the opportunity to provide comments and would be pleased to respond to any questions you may have.
