My name is Kate Thompson, I've been a teacher since 1981 and I am currently the teacher-librarian at Olathe Northwest High School. In addition to my teaching position, I serve on the Professional Standards Board and I am a National Board Certified Teacher in Library/Media EC-12<sup>th</sup> grade. I am opposed to Senate Bill Number 212.

We are already prohibited from contributing to our Political Action Committee via payroll deduction, but this bill goes further. This bill seeks to continue to restrict my right to make choices as a consumer for a service that I value. This legislature is attempting to force its values upon me.

In conclusion, I ask you to consider that my participation in my professional association is a valuable consumer choice that should not be restricted.
