## Written Testimony for Pat George's Confirmation Hearing - KBA

Pat George currently serves as the CEO of Valley Hope Association. He began serving as CEO July 2015. Valley Hope Association is a drug and alcohol treatment organization that has 16 facilities in 7 states focused on assisting individuals with substance abuse disorder. He served on the Board of Directors, including chairman, for Valley Hope Association for the past 14 years.

Prior to accepting this position, Mr. George served as the Kansas Secretary of Commerce, beginning in January 2011.
