Subject: HB 2512

I am writing to clarify the position of the Accounting & Information Systems Area at the University of Kansas on HB 2512, which would allow students to sit for the certified Public Accountant exam within sixty day of their graduation. Our position on this proposed legislation is neutral, as it will have little, if any, effect on the behavior of our accounting students. The vast majority of KU accounting graduates take positions with public accounting firms in Kansas City, Missouri and other locales. These students sit for the exam under the state in which they will be employed. Our students will not sit for the exam in the state of Kansas if this legislation becomes law because they would then face administrative hurdles in attaining reciprocity from the state in which they are employed.

In my opinion and that of other KU accounting faculty, HB 2512 will have no discernable effect on the number of University of Kansas accounting students sitting for the exam in the state of Kansas.
