PROPOSED AMENDMENTS FOR SB2331

<u>State Fair Amendment</u>, effective 7.1.16, allows only sale of wine in original container (not beer) and makes it clear the number of such wine or beer or both permits is based upon state fair board decision.

(2) On or after July 1, 2016 The director may issue one a sufficient number of temporary permits, as required by the state fair board, valid for the entire period of time of the Kansas state fair, which authorizes the sale of wine or beer, or both, in its original, unopened container and the serving by the drink of only wine or beer, or both, on the state fairgrounds on premises specified in the temporary permit, by a person who has entered into an agreement with the state fair board for that purpose subject to the conditions imposed by the state fair board. Nothing in this subsection (f)(2) shall be construed to limit the number of temporary permits the director may issue for the sale of wine or beer, or both, on the state fairgrounds, consistent with the requirements of the state fair board.

TRAVELING VINYARD AMENDMENT (ABC was consulted regarding this amendment)

ALLOWS FOR IN-HOME TASTINGS, BY REGISTERED AGENTS OF THE WINERY, WITH NOTICE TO STATE ABC FOLLOWING EXISITING TRADE PRACTICE REGULATION

Notwithstanding the <u>definition set forth in</u> K.S.A. 41-102 <u>definition</u> of "to sell", a winery holding a special order shipping license may market its wines and receive orders through any means of communication, including but not limited to, the internet, written correspondence, telephonically or through orders transmitted from <u>registered</u> <u>compensated</u> agents <u>hosting</u> <u>participating in</u> private, in state, wine tastings <u>or otherwise</u>. <u>in accordance with the trade</u> <u>practice regulations promulgated by the secretary. A licensee shall provide electronic notification to the director at least 48 hours prior to any event at which the licensee will host a wine tasting.</u>
