# <u>Hearing on: SB268 — Changes to stream maintenance and obstruction requirements.</u>

Chairman Powell opened the hearing on the bill.

Tamera Lawrence presented an overview.

Richard Ranzau presented testimony in support of the bill commenting Sedgwick County stream maintenance projects are exempt from all state, federal and local agency permit requirements except Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism. (Attachment 1) Additional photos of projects from Jester Creek, Little Arkansas, Cowskin, Clearwater and Dry Creeks were provided. (Attachment 2)

Jason Luginbill presented testimony in opposition to the bill stating 91% of residents agreed that the Department should continue to protect habitat critical to the existence of threatened and endangered species. (Attachment 3)

Zack Pistora presented testimony in opposition to the bill commenting it is crucial that staff biologists maintain statutory authority to protect in-stream wildlife from activities which local governments might consider routine maintenance. (Attachment 4)

Rob Manes submitted written testimony in opposition to the bill stating it would severely undermine the application of sound science and public policy for stream maintenance. (Attachment 5)

Steve Sorensen submitted written testimony in opposition to the bill commenting it would move Sedgwick County from zone one, to zone two, allowing their watershed drainage limit to be doubled.

#### Discussion:

<u>Senator Kerschen moved, Senator Francisco seconded SB275 be favorably recommended for passage.</u>

<u>Senator Arpke moved, Senator Francisco seconded the contents of SB275 be inserted into HB2177 as</u> a Substitute. Motion adopted.

<u>Senator Arpke moved, Senator Francisco seconded **Substitute HB2177** be passed favorably as recommended. Motion adopted.</u>
