- > No one is forced to seek easements that protect the land. But the land trusts that have been developing as the need to protect the land has been recognized make that possibility a reality. It is not a simple endeavor and the County Commissions don't have sufficient access to the information on the varied factors involved in preservation decisions and thus are not the right place for that duty to rest. The state is and can carry out such duties well as it has been doing. By changing that method the ability to protect the great beauty of Kansas land will be essentially lost.
- > We contend that SB 425 is wrongheaded and seems to us to intend stopping the development of easements that protect the land outright.
