Chairperson Pilcher-Cook briefed the committee on the reason she sent each committee member a copy of the Kansas Bureau of Investigation "*Methamphetamine Recommendation Report for Calendar Year* 2014."

<u>Hearing on: HB2149 — Relating to donor human breast milk.</u>

Chairperson Pilcher-Cook opened the hearing on <u>HB2149</u>. Renae Jefferies, staff revisor, reviewed the bill.

Dr. Barbara Carr, Pediatrix Medical Group, Saint Luke's Hospital, testified in support of **HB2149**. Dr. Carr stated that **HB2149** would allow hospitals to be reimbursed for providing medically prescribed donor human milk (DHM) to critically ill infants who are under three months of age and receiving treatment in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit of a hospital. Dr. Carr indicated that many infants do not have access to this recommended therapy as DHM is often seen as a nutritional supplement by third party payers. (Attachment 1)

After all questions by the committee were addressed, Chairperson Pilcher-Cook closed the hearing on **HB2149**.

Informational hearing:

Chairperson Pilcher-Cook opened the informational hearing on <u>SB39--Updating statutory references</u> and making corresponding changes due to 2012 E.R.O. No. 41. The Chair stated that this is a bill that was heard in the Judiciary Committee that she would like for the committee to be able to consider. Renae Jefferies reviewed the bill.
