## Possible action on bills previously heard

Chairperson Pilcher-Cook stated that the committee needed to reconsider a bill that had been passed out of committee.

Senator Love moved, Senator Kelly seconded, that the committee reconsider its action taken on S Sub for HB2043--Secretaries for children and families and for aging and disability services; powers, duties and functions. Motion carried.

Senator Love moved, Senator Denning seconded, to remove SB39--Updating statutory references and making corresponding changes due to 2012 E.R.O. No. 41 from S Sub for HB2043 and to insert SB39, as amended by the Judiciary Committee, to S Sub for HB2043. After questions were answered, motion carried.

<u>Senator Love moved, Senator Kelly seconded, to recommend **S Sub for HB2043** favorably for passage. <u>Motion carried.</u></u>

<u>Hearing on: SB285</u> — <u>Healing arts licensees, resident active licenses and health care records.</u>
Chairperson Pilcher-Cook opened the hearing on <u>SB285</u>. Renae Jefferies, staff revisor, reviewed the bill. Ms. Jefferies stated that there is a technical amendment making changes that the bill needed. (<u>Attachment 1</u>) Chairperson Pilcher-Cook presented a briefing on the House version of this legislation,

**HB2362--healing arts licensees, resident active licenses and health care records**. After questions from the committee were addressed, the hearing continued.

Kathleen Selzler Lippert, Kansas State Board of Healing Arts, testified in support of **SB285**. Ms. Lippert highlighted some of the provisions of **SB285** and described those changes. (Attachment 2)

Jerry Slaughter, KMS, testified in support of <u>SB285</u>. Mr. Slaughter indicated that this bill is a continuation of the large modernization update of the Healing Arts Act from last year. Mr. Slaughter described some of the provisions included in <u>SB285</u> including a "special permit" and language regarding guidelines for access to medical records. (<u>Attachment 3</u>)

Doug Smith, KAPA, testified in support of <u>SB285</u>. Mr. Smith addressed some of the provisions included in the bill that relate to physician assistants. Four areas that Mr. Smith addressed were creating a "federally active license"; a new exempt license category for physician assistants; language to authorize physician assistants to sign off on Do Not Resuscitate (DNR) orders when admitting a patient to medical care facilities and adult care homes; and extending the effective date of last year's legislative changes contained in 2014 HB2673 until January 2016. Chairperson Pilcher-Cook closed the hearing on **SB285**.

<u>Hearing on: SB254 — Behavioral sciences regulatory board; licensure of professions.</u>
Chairperson Pilcher-Cook opened the hearing on <u>SB254</u>. Nobuko Folmsbee, staff revisor, reviewed the bill.

Max L. Foster, BSRB, testified in support of <u>SB254</u>. Mr. Foster indicated that <u>SB254</u> is legislation that impacts various statutes administered by the BSRB. He stated that the language in <u>SB254</u> standardizes specific regulatory statutes administered by the BSRB as they are applied to the professions regulated by the agency. Mr. Foster provided a brief summary of the changes in the bill. (<u>Attachment 5</u>)

Dr. Darrel Regier, APA, testified in opposition of <u>SB254</u> presenting testimony submitted by Saul Levin, MD, MPA, CEO and Medical Director. Dr. Regier stated they were concerned about the deletion of a reference to the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual for Mental Disorders (DSM) which is a common reference point for diagnosis for mental disorders for all of the mental health professions. Chairperson Pilcher-Cook announced due to time restraints, the hearing on **SB254** will be continued tomorrow.

After questions by the committee were addressed, the meeting was adjourned at 2:29 p.m.
