<u>Final action on: SB465 — Use of certain controlled substances to treat binge eating authorized.</u> Chairperson O'Donnell opened final action on <u>SB465</u>.

<u>Senator Denning moved, Senator Bowers seconded, to recommend **SB465** favorably for passage.</u>

Motion carried.

### <u>Final action on: SB456 — Electronic monitoring in adult care homes.</u>

Chairperson O'Donnell opened final action on **SB456**. Scott Abbott, staff revisor, distributed and explained a balloon amendment. (Attachment 1)

Senator O'Donnell moved, Senator Bowers seconded, to adopt the balloon amendment. After some discussion, motion carried.

Discussion ensued. Chairperson O'Donnell indicated that due to the committee's questions and concerns, further action on the bill would be held until a later date.

# <u>Final action on: SB477 — Establishing legislative oversight of state psychiatric hospitals.</u>

Chairperson O'Donnell opened final action on <u>SB477</u>. Senator Holmes reviewed the bill and discussed a possible amendment. After discussion, Senator Holmes decided not to bring forth an amendment at this time.

Senator Holmes moved, Senator Kelly seconded, to recommend SB477 favorably for passage. Motion

# <u>Final action on: SB495 — Eliminating medical assistance coverage for elective induced labor prior to 39 weeks of pregnancy.</u>

Chairperson O'Donnell opened final action on <u>SB495</u>. Senator LaTurner distributed a balloon amendment. Scott Abbott explained the amendment. (Attachment 2)

Senator LaTurner moved, Senator Love seconded, to adopt the balloon amendment. Motion carried.

<u>Senator LaTurner moved, Senator Holmes seconded to recommend **SB495** as amended, favorably for passage. Motion carried.</u>

## <u>Final action on: SB489 — Hemp oil treatments for specified medical conditions.</u>

Chairperson O'Donnell opened final action on <u>SB489</u>. Senator LaTurner distributed a balloon amendment and discussed his recommended changes. Scott Abbott explained the amendment. (<u>Attachment 3</u>)

Chairperson O'Donnell invited Representative John Wilson to address the amendment. After some discussion, Senator LaTurner requested permission for a representative of the Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI) to address the amendment. Katie Whisman, Executive Officer, KBI, addressed some of the challenges that have been seen by states who have allowed in-state production. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Abbott suggested one addition for clarification to more accurately reflect the intent of the described amendment. Mr. Abbott's suggested changes would add "located and operating outside of the state of Kansas" after "organization" in the second line of the block on the last page of the amendment. Mr. Abbott stated that this would just be clarification for the Kansas Department of Health and Environment's authority to approve a facility.

<u>Senator LaTurner moved, Senator Denning seconded, to adopt the balloon amendment with staff</u>
<u>having technical latitude to make the agreed upon corrections to the amendment. After some</u>
<u>discussion, motion carried.</u> Senator Haley voted no and requested his vote recorded.

Senator Denning distributed a balloon amendment and explained that this amendment would say that they have to be employed by a healthcare facility licensed by the state of Kansas. Senator Denning proposed changing "employed by" in the amendment to which Scott Abbott suggested striking "employed by" and inserting "practicing in." Senator Denning agreed to that technical change with the Chair's permission. (Attachment 4)

Senator Denning moved, Senator Bowers seconded, to adopt the balloon amendment with staff having technical latitude to make the agreed upon corrections to the amendment. Motion carried.

Senator Denning distributed a balloon amendment. Scott Abbott reviewed the recommended changes indicating that there are a number of amendments in this balloon that will not happen because those sections have been stricken in light of the previous amendment. (Attachment 5)

After some discussion, Senator Denning moved, Senator LaTurner seconded, to adopt the balloon amendment with staff having technical latitude to clarify 0.3% to apply to patients under the age of 21 for epilepsy; and, 3% for age 21 or older to apply to all the diagnosis codes and medical conditions that were listed in the original bill. After discussion, the motion carried.

Senator Denning distributed a balloon amendment and explained the recommended changes. (Attachment 6)

Senator Denning moved, Senator Love seconded, to adopt the balloon amendment. Motion carried.

Senator Denning distributed a balloon amendment and discussed his recommended changes. Scott Abbott explained the amendment. (Attachment 7)

<u>After some discussion, Senator Denning moved, Senator LaTurner seconded, to adopt the balloon</u> <u>amendment. Motion carried.</u> Senator Haley voted no, and requested his vote recorded.

Following discussion, Chairperson O'Donnell moved, Senator Denning seconded, to recommend SB489 as amended with staff having large latitude for technical corrections and clarifications.

Following discussion, with permission from the second, Chairperson O'Donnell withdrew his motion to allow Senator LaTurner to offer a conceptual amendment.

After explaining the conceptual amendment, Senator LaTurner moved, Senator Bowers seconded, to amend **SB489** conceptually to have 1% tetrahydrocannabinols (THC) for adults 21 and over, and 15% cannabidiol (CBD) minimum requirement for everyone. Motion carried. Senator Kelly requested her pass vote be recorded.

<u>Chairperson O'Donnell moved, Senator Bowers seconded, to recommend **SB489** as amended, with staff having latitude for technical corrections and clarifications, favorably for passage. Motion carried. Senator Kelly requested her pass vote be recorded.</u>

<u>Final action on: HB2571 — Licensure renewal of community mental health centers.</u> Chairperson O'Donnell opened final action on <u>HB2571</u>.

<u>Senator LaTurner moved, Senator Haley seconded, to recommend **HB2571** favorably for passage and be placed on the consent calendar. Motion carried.</u>
