Safety Reviews: MCO Intervention



(Zyprexa) + other psychotropic meds Member, 5 years old, on 20mg of olanzapine

- No prior evaluation for ADHD or trial of stimulants
- No psychosis. Psychiatric diagnosis of Mood Disorder.

Adjustments in prescription Outreach by health plan medical director Psychotropic medication utilization review (PMUR)



Health Medications Goals with Behavioral



- Maintain availability of anti-psychotics (APs) and other BH medications for members
- Preserve medication therapy for members who are stable
- under 5 y/o multiple APs and use of APs among patients Safety edits - Circumvent chronic use of
- Adherence and rapid response to FDA safety advisories

first quarter of 2006.








