Step Therapy Overview

Step therapy is the practice of beginning drug therapy for a medical condition with the most cost-effective drug before progressing to other more costly drugs, if needed.

- Kansas statute currently prohibits step therapy in Medicaid
- SB 341 eliminates the prohibition against step therapy in KanCare



Step Therapy Overview

- Step therapy has been applied in commercial insurance for a number of years
- Step therapy is utilized in Medicare
- The dual population within KanCare, a shared population where Medicare is the first payer, already operates under step therapy



Highlights of Step Therapy

- Passing SB 341 will allow the implementation of step therapy for new prescriptions in Medicaid
- Step therapy will not apply to current medication regimens
- Step therapy will not require the prescriber to issue a prescription for a generic medication
- Provider can identify intent for prescription to be filled as written by signing prescription on the "Dispense as written" line
