

TESTIMONY IN SUPPORT OF HB 2044

AN ACT CONCERNING MOTOR VEHICLES; RELATING TO AUTOCYCLES.

Good morning Chairman Petersen and Members of the Senate Committee on Transportation. I appear before you today on behalf of Polaris Industries in support of HB 2044 creating a class of vehicle called an "autocycle".

Late in 2015 I was retained by Polaris Industries to seek changes to several off-road vehicle definitions, which this Committee will recall in the form of SB 73. At that time, the Division of Motor Vehicles inquired with me about the Polaris Slingshot product and how it might (or might not) fit into current motor vehicle definitions. This same discussion has been held in a number of other states which have taken various statutory and regulatory measures to accommodate appropriate licensing standards for these kinds of products. It was during this time I became aware of HB 2044 by Representative Travis Couture-Lovelady.

After meetings, statehouse discussions and e-mail exchanges with Representative Couture-Lovelady, DMV and the Kansas Highway Patrol, it appeared the most expedient route to resolving this matter for the Slingshot and similar vehicles in our state was to amend HB 2044 in two places by removing the word "enclosed" which would then bring the Slingshot under the new autocycle definition.

By way of information, the Slingshot is federally certified as a three-wheel motorcycle, though it has similar characteristics to both passenger vehicles and motorcycles. This has led Polaris, and manufacturers of similar vehicles, to seek updates to state motor vehicle definitions across the country where existing statutes do not currently provide for this new vehicle category. A picture of a Polaris Slingshot is attached to my testimony.

The House Transportation Committee accepted our amendment and the bill advanced to the floor, where it was approved on a vote of 123-0. The bill has no fiscal note.

Assuming for a moment this legislation is approved, an autocycle will not be regulated as a motorcycle in regard to qualifications for licensure and helmet laws. An operator will not be required to obtain a motorcycle certification to operate an autocycle, including a Slingshot nor will they be able to utilize these products to qualify for a motorcycle license.

These kinds of products are not unique to Polaris Industries and the definition is not inclusive of only the Slingshot.
